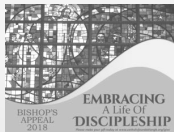

Hear to Serve.....

FEED THE HUNGRY, CLOTHE THE NAKED, AND GIVE DRINK TO THE THIRSTY

A couple of weeks ago Father Pat at the end of Mass was talking about our practice of giving up things for Lent. Father suggested that instead of giving up something for Lent we might instead try to do something charitable for the poor and needy of the world. Father talked about the Catholic Social Teachings of feeding the poor, clothing the naked, giving drink to the thirsty of the world.

We all know that our reach can be pretty limited, it may be impossible for us to go to third world countries and tend to the impoverished on a personal level. However, there is an easier way to meet Father's challenge and that is in the back of our Church at this very moment. That easy answer is called the CRS Rice Bowl.

C.R.S. stands for Catholic Relief Services. It is a Catholic organization that is dedicated to helping the poor of the world. Out of every dollar collected in the Rice bowls only seven cents goes to administrative costs. The rest goes to the poor. There is not a financial institution or a government in the world that gives you a better return on your dollar.

Besides providing food for the poor C.R.S. has agricultural programs to help subsistence farmers have more productive farms. There are micro finance programs to help small business in third world countries. They provide people with the ability to have clean water and proper sanitation. C.R.S. sponsors mother/child health projects, and they also have general education programs.

Go to the C.R.S. Rice Bowl online. There you can also meet part of your prayer requirements. C.R.S. has Stations of the Cross, Daily Reflections, and a section on the Saints. The entire site is designed to help you on your Lenten journey. They also have meatless recipes from around the world so you can experience firsthand how the poor eat. Patty doesn't know it yet, but as I sit and write this column at 4:30 in the morning, I have also copied the recipe for Dalma with Spinach a recipe from India. I hope she likes her supper tonight.

Father threw the challenge out there. Let us go and meet that challenge without having to break a sweat. Take a Rice Bowl. If you have one and you are well on way to filling it, take another one. Don't be shy. I found that the car is a great place to keep one. What more convenient place to have to drop your change into after you go through a drive-through? When we come out of a store and you have that few cents change that just seems to end up rolling around in your car or sitting at the bottom of your purse there will be a place to put it that will end up doing a world of good.

There you have it, one small piece of cardboard that can change a life...maybe even your own. The Rice Bowl is one small piece of cardboard that helps you meet not only your Lenten obligations, but your obligation as a disciple of Christ. Visit www.crsricebowl.org
