### Pastor's Perspective ...

#### GOD OF LOVE AND UNITY



Today we celebrate all Three Persons of the Blessed Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The three Persons of the Blessed Trinity are but one God. They are not three persons in one Person; neither are they three gods in one God.

The mystery of the most Blessed Trinity is a basic doctrine of Faith in Christianity, understandable not with our heads but with our hearts. It teaches us that there are three distinct Persons in one God, sharing the same Divine Nature. Our mind cannot grasp this doctrine which teaches that 1+1+1 = 1 and not 3. We believe in this Mystery because Jesus who is God taught it clearly, the Evangelists recorded it, the Fathers of the Church tried to explain it and the Councils of Nicaea and Constantinople defined it as a dogma of Christian Faith.

To show the importance of this doctrine in our Christian life, all our liturgical celebrations in the Church begin in the name of the Blessed Trinity. All the Sacraments in the Church are administered in the name of the Blessed Trinity. We bless ourselves, and the priest blesses us, in the name of the Blessed Trinity.

There are only vague and hidden references to the Trinity in the Old Testament, but the New Testament gives clearer teachings on it. At the Annunciation, God the Father sends His angel to Mary, God the Holy Spirit overshadowed her, and God the Son became incarnate in her womb. At the baptism of Jesus, the Father's voice was heard, and the Holy Spirit appeared as a dove. At the Ascension, Jesus gives the missionary command to his disciples to baptize those who would believe, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

In John, chapters 15-18, we have a detailed account of Jesus' teaching of the role of each Person of the Blessed Trinity: God the Father creates and provides for His creatures. God the Son redeems us and reconciles us with God the Father. God the Holy Spirit sanctifies us, strengthens us, teaches us and guides us to God the Father.

My dear friends in Christ, what does the doctrine of the Blessed Trinity tell us about the kind of God we are worshipping, and what does this say about the kind of people we should be? Today's solemnity teaches us that the God we are worshipping is the God of love and unity. Let us practice the Trinitarian relationship of love and unity in the family relationships of father, mother and children, because by virtue of Baptism, we are children of God and members of God's Trinitarian family.

As we celebrate the solemnity of the Blessed Trinity today, let us pray that the love and unity which God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit share may be established among us. Amen.
