## Thoughts for Today's Readings

**To the Point:** Three verbs at the end of the gospel summarize Jesus' ministry: teaching, preaching, curing. This gives us a preview of his years of active work; this is what we can expect of Jesus' ministry.

Names are also important in the gospel: these place names remind us that Jesus' ministry took place in the real world, in a place with a history and people. New characters are also identified by name: Simon who is called Peter, his brother Andrew; James and John, the sons of Zebedee. These are real people in real places. They have family ties and daily tasks. And Jesus calls them by name. He comes to them right where they are, in all the realness and fullness of their lives, and he calls them to something greater.

**To Experience:** For the apostles called in this gospel, following Jesus meant giving up the concrete realities of their lives and careers and communities. We are given the specific place names of these events to remind us that they are real. They affect real, specific, complex people with stories and families. For us, too, specific places form part of our story. Some serve as homes and comforts; others are special places of brief encounter with God. Some places become places to settle; others are left behind. God is present in all of them, working in each of our specific contexts.

## Year of Mary October 1, 2022 to December 8, 2023

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Gospel that is read at Mass this Sunday includes Jesus' first recorded sermon. It is only one line, and can easily be committed to memory.

"Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand"
(Matthew 4:17b).

The early baptism practice of the church dramatically illustrates repentance. When an adult was baptized in the early church, he or she would be asked to make their baptismal promises. "Do you reject Satan? And all his works? And all of his empty promises?" The catechumen would be facing in a westerly direction while responding to these questions with a hearty "I do." After responding to the last of these questions, the catechumen would spit towards the west, and then turn towards the east.\* Only after turning towards the east did the catechumen continue to make their baptismal promises. "Do you believe in God..."

Repenting is literally turning in a different direction.
This ritual illustrates a basic principle: Before we embrace the Faith, we must turn away from evil and im-

morality.

Although REPENT is Jesus' first recorded word, I hardly recall any homilies or religious lessons that focused on Jesus' call to repentance. Repentance has not been a common theme of preaching or teaching. As a preacher, I can say it is difficult to echo Jesus' call to repentance. Like any other discipline, very few people enjoy hearing a call to repentance. This goes a long way towards explaining my own hesitation to preach about repentance, and the glaring negligence among preachers and teachers of the faith.

Yet, Jesus' words cannot simply be set aside. It does not matter if they are challenging or unpopular, Jesus' words cannot simply be set aside.

sus' words cannot simply be set aside.

Although Jesus' first sermon was extremely short, it is also extremely challenging. Repentance is difficult. Repentance requires humility. Humility is required to accept that we are not perfect, and often we are attached to sinful words and actions. Repentance is frustrating. Sin, evil and immorality seem to be "sticky." And even when we recognize that we are attached to words and actions, it is often only through the challenging path of penance, prayer and fasting that we are able to break the bondage of sin in our lives.

Despite the challenges and struggles that repentance entails, those who take this commitment seriously often find that repentance is the <u>first step towards joy</u>. Jesus never asks us to sacrifice without promising that we will receive something even greater in return. If Jesus' first word is REPENT, recall also some of his last words, "These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and your joy may be full" (John 15:11, ESV).

## Blessings, Father Bill





Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children

January 23



Life is at the heart of the gospel – a beautiful gift from God. When that gift is destroyed rather than treasured, a violent act is committed not just against God, but all humanity.

#### The Church's Call to Defend Life

Each and every human being is created in the image of God and possesses inherent dignity and value. As the Scriptures tell us:

God created mankind in his image; in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. – Genesis 1:26-27

The Church has a particular duty to care for each and every individual – born and unborn. Pope John Paul II observed:

Every individual, precisely by reason of the mystery of the Word of God who was made flesh (cf. John 1:14), is entrusted to the maternal care of the Church. Therefore every threat to human dignity and life must necessarily be felt in the Church's very heart; it cannot but affect her at the core of her faith in the Redemptive Incarnation of the Son of God, and engage her in her mission of proclaiming the Gospel of life in all the world and to every creature (cf. Mark 16:15). On this day, we commit ourselves in prayer to the legal protection of the inherent dignity of each person, born and unborn.

## The Moral Imperative to Defend the Vulnerable and Uphold the Family

Violating the right to life rejects the inherent value and dignity of the human person at a time when he or she is most defenseless and vulnerable. The mother's womb, which should be the safest place in the world for a child, becomes a site of violence in this cruel infraction against the family. The commitment to defend the weak and preserve the family is not just a Christian commitment – it should be one that all with a basic concern for humanity can stand behind. St. Mother Teresa once remarked, "If we let a mother kill the fruit of her womb, what is left to us? It is the principle of abortion that endangers peace in the world."

## Pray for the Legal Protection of the Unborn

We ask that you pray for the respect and protection of life at its earliest and most vulnerable stage, as Pope John Paul II once exhorted:

Please God you may continue, closely united with one another, to be a force of renewal and hope in our society. May the Lord help you to work ceaselessly to enable all, believers and non-believers alike, to understand that protection of human life from conception is an essential condition for building a future worthy of the human being.
