Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Like many of our Lenten readings, this gospel plays with themes of light and darkness, seeing and blindness. Here, Jesus makes clear that it is easier for God to heal physical blindness than willful refusal

to see God at work. Most of us struggle with some level of spiritual blindness; after all, most of us do not get to witness these clear, decisive miracles of Jesus' time on earth. God does not always operate in ways that are easy for us to perceive. The Pharisees, though, are choosing blindness. Having their eyes opened will challenge a system that keeps them comfortably in power. What God reveals is not always comfortable or easy. We are sometimes called to sacrifice and to use our positions of privilege to advocate for others in unpopular ways. But if we *want* to see, God can heal our spiritual blindness, too.

To Experience: The Pharisees are comfortable with their blindness, unable to recognize how much they don't see. We, too, are often content to remain in ignorance, especially when God's light reveals truth that is uncomfortable. We know God sides with the oppressed, and so we'd rather not know when we've benefited from oppression. This is the work of Lent, though; all the prayer and fasting and almsgiving are meant to illumine places where our lives are keeping us from God, and to aid us in turning away from them, uncomfortable though it may be.

1. Where might there be a pocket of blindness in your own life? How could you invite God in to heal it?
2. What are your real values in life—where do you *really* spend your time, attention, energy, and money? Do any of these conflict with who you profess to be?
3. Does anything about God's work in these readings make you uncomfortable? How might that be a call to action?

Hear to Serve

I DO BELIEVE, LORD

In this week's Gospel we hear of a blind man, a man who was blind since birth, a man who was accustomed to living in darkness. He had no idea what it meant to see light until Jesus came and cured him of his blindness. It was only when Jesus gave him the gift of sight that he could understand. When he saw the light, he saw the truth. The man understood better than the Pharisees who Jesus was, he understood that Jesus is the Light of the World. The man could proclaim, "I do believe, Lord."

This Lent we should ask ourselves if we are blind to the "Light of the World." Now, I realize we are not talking about being physically blind from birth. I'm talking about being spiritually blind from sin. This can be so much worse because our life here on earth is short but eternity, well, that's forever.

We become blind to the harm that sin does to us. We think, "My sins are my own. My sins really don't hurt anyone." We let them build and fester inside of us over the weeks, the months, and the years. Pretty soon the eyes of our souls become clouded-over. We lose our ability to see the light. We become cynical, not just towards the world, but towards God also. We stumble around in the dark.

But just as Jesus restored the blind man's hope and confidence through a personal encounter, Jesus will do the same for us through His Sacraments. In this case, the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

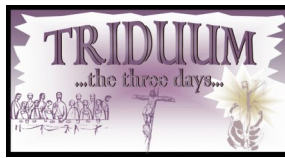
I realize I may have just made a whole lot of you flinch. It's a well-known fact that the Sacrament of Reconciliation is the forgotten Sacrament. For some reason, it seems the world has come under the attitude that forgiveness from the Lord is something I can do on my own. But if you read through the Bible, you will see that the sacrifices of the people, the forgiveness of sins always involved a mediator (a priest) between them and God.

Back to the point, if we do not have our Spiritual Blindness cured by Jesus in His sacrament of Reconciliation, we will never see the light. We will never understand. We will never receive the graces of His greatest Sacrament the Eucharist. We remain in the dark. I do not wish to sound harsh, but this is the reality. I say these things out of love for Christ and you.

Lent is a perfect time to come face to face with the reality of our spiritual blindness. It is time for all of us to experience a personal encounter with Jesus in Confession. It is there that we find healing and are cured of our blindness. In the light of Christ, our sight is restored, and we can see the truth. We too can proclaim, "I do believe, Lord."

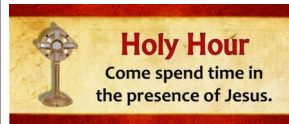

Overview of Finance Council Responsibilities:

- Oversees the accounting system for the parish and the keeping of financial records
- Oversees the creation of an annual budget in accord with the mission, goals, priorities and plans
- Provides an analysis of income and expenditures in comparison to budget projections
- Assures that a complete and understandable annual financial report is made to parishioners
- Ensures that financial procedures for internal controls are in place for the oversight of cash and financial accounts
- Makes recommendations for the generation of revenue in support of the overall mission of the parish
- Oversees and coordinates all fundraising within the parish in accord with Church Canon Law & the Diocesan proxy process
- Monitors investments
- Oversees the day-to-day and long-range maintenance of parish buildings and grounds
- Monitors the observance of diocesan personnel policies pertaining to labor and the conduct of business in employment and compensation of workers

Overview of Parish Council Responsibilities:

- Works in collaboration with the pastor and staff to discern and carry out the will of God for our parish now and into the future
- Works with the pastor, staff, committees, and parish organizations for the common good and mission of the parish
- Assists in the development of parish policies and strategies to address concerns and needs
- Collaborates with pastor to assess needs, establish goals and priorities and review the overall operation of the parish for the previous year

Membership Terms (for both Councils):

- Member at Large—Serve for a three year term, renewable once
- Secretary & Treasurer Trustee—Serve for a two year term, renewable twice (elected position)
 - Treasurer Trustee—a member of the finance council
 - Secretary Trustee—a member of the parish council

Treasurer Trustee

- Serves as member of Finance Council
- Assists with review and adherence to Parish Financial Instructions
- Assists with overseeing the coordination and maintenance of accurate and detailed accounts of all receipts and disbursements of parish funds
- Assists in the collection of parish contributions and special collections
- Assists in management of parish investments
- Assures timely preparation and distribution of financial reports to the parish and the diocese
- Assures that records of all parish property, property tax documents and parish inventory are maintained

Secretary Trustee

- Serves as member of Pastoral Council
- Assists with ensuring the pastoral care of the parish
- Ensures the parish annual meeting is held
- Assists in taking and keeping minutes of all meetings of the corporate board of directors
- Attends to corporate notices and correspondence
- Assists to ensure that proxy documents are recorded and filed.
- Ensures that all corporate reports as prescribed by federal, state, local, and diocesan authorities are prepared and filed
- Assists in development of parish policies and strategies to address the needs and mission of the church

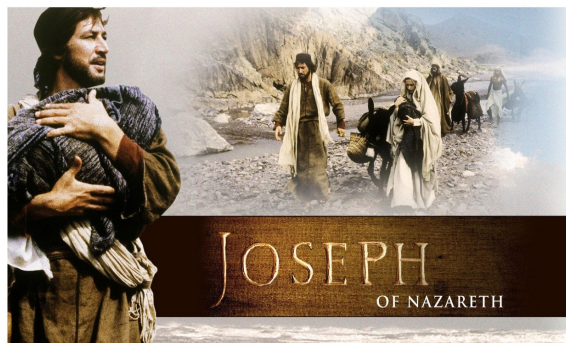
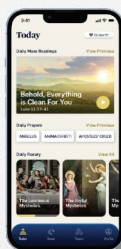
