### Thoughts for Today's Readings

**To the Point:** Mary and Martha reverse roles here. Where Mary once sat at the feet of Jesus, she now sits at home in her grief. Martha, however, the one who was too busy to listen, comes to him as interlocutor, intelligently and faithfully interacting with him. She does not see the whole picture, though, for Jesus is still in the process of revealing all that his life means for the world. Lazarus here becomes a sort of firstfruits, one restored to life before the full restoration occurs. Wonderful as this miracle is, it is a jarring one; this simply does not happen. People who have been dead for four days do not come back to life. And we know nothing of Lazarus's experience here. Whatever his experience was of death, it must have been unsettling to be jolted back to life. Jesus is here to bring life, yes, but he brings it in ways that disrupt the order of things to which we have grown accustomed.

**To Experience:** When Jesus calls us to fuller life in him, it is not always comfortable or easy. There are often demands and sacrifices we would not have expected and certainly would not have chosen for ourselves. But while Lazarus stood alone as the first called forth from the tomb, we are never left alone with our challenges; it is Christ's own life that we share, and he accompanies us always.

1. How have you experienced Jesus' life-giving power? Is it easy or challenging to live out the demands of life with him?
2. How has inviting God into your life upended your expectations?
3. Does your life of faith lead to rest or to further restlessness? Knowing that God can work through either, how do you choose to respond?

**Year of Mary**

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

How do you feel when it seems like God does not answer your prayer? Today's Gospel begins with an earnest prayer: "The sisters of Lazarus sent word to Jesus, saying 'Master, the one you love is ill.'" Jesus does not promptly respond. Rather he waits two days, and in the meantime Lazarus dies.

Imagine the feelings and thoughts going through the hearts and minds of the sisters. They wait in expectation for their friend, yet he delays. They are disappointed when their brother dies. They have no way of understanding why Jesus didn't come. We sympathize with them, since each of us have had the experience of earnestly imploring the Lord and not receiving the response for which we hoped.

The Lord could cure Lazarus. He is not apathetic to the prayers of his friends. He cares for Lazarus. It would be good to heal Lazarus, but Jesus has something even greater in mind. This is a principle of our relationship with God. God is not satisfied to give us something that is "merely good," nor will he settle for giving us something better. He will only be satisfied to give us the BEST.

There are two responses to the unanswered prayer of Martha and Mary. First we see that Martha and Mary express Faith and Trust in the Lord, even though their prayer seems unanswered. They are confident that Jesus has the power to heal. They trust that even though their brother has died, he will rise on the last day. The other response is that of the crowds, who sneer and deride, "Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?"








It is a much greater miracle to raise someone from the dead than it is to cure an illness. So Jesus, who by his tears, shows that he is not indifferent to our grief, goes to the tomb, and calls Lazarus from the domain of death back to the land of the living. "Lazarus, come out!" Martha and Mary asked the Lord for something good, the healing of their brother. The Lord provided something even greater, that he was raised from the dead. But this is not yet the best.

If Jesus had merely cured Lazarus, the miracle would have been merely private, known only to those who already believed that he was the Messiah and the Resurrection. By raising Lazarus from the dead, Jesus not only affirms the faith of Martha and Mary, and his disciples, but everyone who witnessed this miracle began to believe in Christ. The community of Faith was expanded.

Although Lazarus was raised to life here on earth, he will die another earthly death. There is a great life that Jesus wishes to give us. "I am the Resurrection and the Life, whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die," says the Lord.

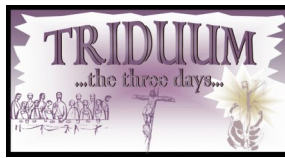
God will never settle for giving us what is "merely good." But often what we ask for in prayer falls far short of the best that God wants to give us. So we offer prayers, but God seems to respond with silence and delay. Yet, in reality he is deepening our hope and drawing us deeper in faith that the holy desires of our heart may begin to yearn for the great graces that he wishes to give to us. This type of prayer requires us to imitate the FAITH and TRUST of Martha and Mary, rather than the sneering of the crowds. How do you respond?

### Why do we cover statues and images with a veil during Lent?

The last two weeks in the season of Lent are called Passiontide which begins on the Fifth Sunday of Lent. This is when the Church shifts her focus from Christ in the desert (the Gospel for the First Sunday of Lent) to Christ during His Passion.

During this period of Passiontide, you may have noticed in your parish that the crucifix and other statues and images around the church have been veiled with a purple cloth.

In the *Roman Missal* we find the instruction, "In the Dioceses of the United States, the practice of covering crosses and images throughout the church from [the fifth] Sunday [of Lent] may be observed. Crosses remain covered until the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil."

The practice of veiling images alerts us that something is different, it can be startling at first, but the last two weeks of Lent are a

time of immediate preparation for the celebration of the Sacred Triduum. The veils are hard to miss and they serve as a reminder to get ready!

The veiled images build within us a longing for Easter Sunday. The veils seem out of place, and even counterintuitive. It can seem strange that the crucifix is covered up during Passiontide. Through this absence of images, our senses are heightened and we become more aware of what is missing. Similarly, the suppression of the Alleluia during Lent effectively demonstrates that we are in exile from our true Home, where the angels sing Alleluia without ceasing.

When images are unveiled before the Easter Vigil, we are reminded that we, in a sense, live in a veiled world. It is through our own death that we are able to see our true home, and the veil is lifted. Christ lifts the veil through His Resurrection.

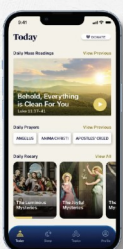
