#### Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: This week's series of parables tells us something about how we are to receive the kingdom of God. Finding it and participating in it is like finding a treasure. It probably brings a bit of wonder; how did we get so lucky as to be included in this? But above all it brings joy, the kind

lucky as to be included in this? But above all it brings joy, the kind of breathtaking joy that leads us to wholehearted pursuit of the thing that brings it. This is the joy of a child who has found an interest that overrides their brain's developmental limits on attention span. This is the joy of someone who has fallen in love. All of these people will find that the object of their interest does not always bring this easy joy. Lovers will find some of their beloveds' flaws hard to live with; children may move on when a new interest fizzles in a challenge they can't overcome; and even God's kingdom makes demands of us and sometimes the sacrifice may seem too much. But the initial joy and wonder tells us something important: this movement of our hearts is how God gets to us.

**To Experience:** Many of us have some experience of encounter God and responding with the kind of wonder and joy and love that causes the person of the parable to sell all he has in pursuit of it. But the long slog of Christian life in a sinful world often causes these feelings to wear off. Love is not measured by our emotional response to the beloved but by our commitment to living out its demands, with consistency and integrity.

- 1. What do you truly value? Consider where you spend your money, your time, and your attention. Do they align with what you claim is important to you?
- 2. Where and when have you encountered God in such a way that it brought you great joy and wonder?
- 3. What have you been called to sacrifice for your commitment to the Christian life? How does that make you feel?

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I am currently finishing up the book Living Joy: 9 Rules to Help You Rediscover and Live Joy Every Day by Chris Stefanick.\* Stefanick is a popular Catholic author. He is a father, a Catholic speaker, and in many ways a very ordinary man. This makes his insights applicable to our daily life, but his deep faith shines through his words. This book is both approachable and deep.

His second rule for everyday joy is "Practice silence." He uses a data driven approach to highlight the effects of our noisy world on our spiritual life and our emotional health. He uses the same data to demonstrate the positive fruits of intentionally cultivating silence as part of our life. These include how an environment of silence helps to cultivate deep thought and substance, how silence leads to wonder and gratitude, and what I found most interesting is how silence helps us to cultivate deep friendships, with both God and with each other.

He offers a simple method of cultivating silence: STOP. BREATHE. THINK.

Stopping takes us out of the rat race of worry. Deep breathing slows down not only the heart rate, but also the rate of our thoughts. Thinking helps us focus on the one thing that matters.

Take a deep and intentional breath. Often we do not think about our breathing. But stopping to take a deep intentional breath, slows us down. One of the classical ways of teaching someone to move from vocal prayer towards meditation is breathing. Pick a short prayer that you have memorized. This could be the "Our Father" or the "Hail Mary." Prayerfully say the first word of the prayer. Stop. Take an intentional breath. Rest a moment to ponder that word. Move to the next word, and repeat.

A few things will probably happen. Your heart rate will slow down, and you will notice yourself relaxing. Most likely, if you are open to it, we will have a sense of God's presence with you in your prayer. And for many people, the meaning of the words seem to open themselves up to you.

Does it take longer? Yes. Of course it does. But it is also enriching.

Silence is not empty, but rather it is the emptiness that makes a space for God.

#### **Nathan Budde**

Parish: St. Mary Parish, Ledgeview Seminary: St. Francis de Sales, St. Francis, WI

What role has the Eucharist played in your discernment of the priesthood?

Eucharist in adoration that stand out in a particular way in my discernment of the priesthood. First, I encountered Jesus during a night of adoration at Camp Tekakwitha during my senior year of high school. As I began praying, Jesus spoke very clearly in the depths of my heart that he desired for me to be his priest. As I continued discernment while attending St. Norbert College, I prayed in front of the Blessed Sacrament during Monday all-day adoration at the National Shrine of St. Joseph. It was there that I fell deeper in love with Jesus and the priesthood. He slowly opened my heart to trust more in him and consider more seriously the possibility of applying to seminary. Throughout seminary, I have found receiving Communion and praying in front of the exposed Eucharist daily to be life-giving and essential to hearing his voice.

# If there was one thing you could communicate to the faithful about the importance and role of the Eucharist in our Catholic faith, what would it be?

The Eucharist is not just a spiritual multivitamin or merely one means among many to receive grace from God. Jesus very specifically said that unless we eat his flesh and drink his blood, we have no life within us. By receiving the Eucharist, we become part of the Body of Christ and share very intimately in his divine life. Jesus enters us and shares in every part of our life — both our joys and burdens. His heart enters our own heart and ours enters his. It is so important to receive the Eucharist because it is through the Eucharist that Jesus makes us more like him. When we receive Communion, we can invite Jesus into the very depths of our being in a personal and intimate way. We share our life with him, and he pours out his life to us in abundance. Receiving the Eucharist brings us into communion with Jesus that gives us divine life and makes us into the people he is calling us to be. Hence, the role of the Eucharist is to make each of us an "alter Christus." or "another Christ," to evangelize the world. We are called to go forth from Mass to bring others to the same Font of Life that we draw life from.

#### Which saint should people invoke for your vocation and why?

Please pray to Blessed Solanus Casey for my vocation. He attended St. Francis de Sales Seminary for five years (and lived on the same floor as me) and is a powerful example of priestly service.



# Saint John Vianney's Story Feast Day: August 4 Patron Saint: Diocesan Priests, Parish Priests



A statue of St. John Vianney is located in the SG sanctuary on the left side near the sanctuary candle.

A man with vision overcomes obstacles and performs deeds that seem impossible. John Vianney was a man with vision: He wanted to become a priest. But he had to overcome his meager formal schooling, which inadequately prepared him for seminary studies.

His failure to comprehend Latin lectures forced him to discontinue. But his vision of being a priest urged him to seek private tutoring. After a lengthy battle with the books, John was ordained.

Situations calling for "impossible" deeds followed him everywhere. As pastor of the parish at Ars, John encountered people who were indifferent and quite comfortable with their

style of living. His vision led him through severe fasts and short nights of sleep.

With Catherine Lassagne and Benedicta Lardet, he established La Providence, a home for girls. Only a man of vision could have such trust that God would provide for the spiritual and material needs of all those who came to make La Providence their home.

His work as a confessor is John Vianney's most remarkable accomplishment. In the winter months he was to spend 11 to 12 hours daily reconciling people with God. In the summer months this time was increased to 16 hours. Unless a man was dedicated to his vision of a priestly vocation, he could not have endured this giving of self day after day.

Many people look forward to retirement and taking it easy, doing the things they always wanted to do but never had the time. But John Vianney had no thoughts of retirement. As his fame spread, more hours were consumed in serving God's people. Even the few hours he would allow himself for sleep were disturbed frequently by the devil.

Who, but a man with vision, could keep going with ever-increasing strength? In 1929, Pope Pius XI named him the patron of parish priests worldwide.


