Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: This is one of the places where the gospels show us Jesus' full humanity; it would seem that his understanding of his own mission is expanded

by his encounter with the Canaanite woman. He is the Son of God, and yet he is *moved* here from unresponsiveness to resistance to, finally, realization that perhaps his work is bigger than even he had realized. He begins his life and work within the context of God's pre-established relationship to Israel. In this movement, it is made clear to him and to us that Jesus is for all people. Faith in him is available to all and his healing ministry is not meant to be limited to some pre-approved group. It is very human to draw boundaries and establish groups; we seek to understand what we need to do to be "in." But God's generosity and hospitality are more radical and inclusive than we can ever understand.

To Experience: Unfortunately, even the church is not exempt from the human tendency to draw exclusive boundaries that name who is in and who is out. Many in the church are excluded because of their gender or income or sexual orientation. On a smaller level, parish activities often unintentionally exclude families whose children don't attend the parochial school and parents who need to work. But God calls us to a more radical inclusiveness, to hospitality that truly loves and receives all.

- 1. What do you make of Jesus in this scene, who seems to change his mind about his own mission?
- What groups are excluded by the culture of the church? In your own parish setting, who might be excluded without you realizing it?
- 3. How might your parish better live out the radical hospitality of God?
- 4. How might you, personally, more fully live out the fundamental inclusiveness that is a trademark of how God works in the world?

"Be still and know that I am God"

Psalm 46:10

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

In this Sunday's Gospel, we meet the Canaanite woman, who is desperately petitioning the Lord for the health and life of her daughter. Surprisingly, the Lord seems to respond to her desperate prayers not with compassion or concern, but rather with indifference and silence.

Does God always answer your prayers? There are a number of petitions that I have offered to God in prayer, and God responded with indifference. God is not a celestial Santa Claus, who is obligated to give us everything that we ask for orwant. God's only promise is to give us what we need to get to heaven.

Not everything that we ask for will help us get to heaven. God sometimes says "no," because he has better things in mind for us. As the experiences of life begin to mature into wisdom, we begin to understand the words of the Garth Brooks song, "Sometimes I thank God for unanswered prayers..."

How do we respond to God's silence? How does this woman respond? We could understand at first if she had responded with frustration and even indignation.

But she doesn't.

She responds with persistence and perseverance. The Lord is on the move, and she persistently follows him. The apostles try to turn her away, but she perseveres through their obstacles. And this actually deepens the woman's prayer and draws her closer into the heart of the Lord. Because of her persistence and perseverance, she receives even more from the Lord than she asked. Not only was her daughter healed, but she was praised by the Lord, "O woman, great is your faith!" Not only did this woman receive the healing of her daughter, but she also received the gift of Faith, a deeper relationship with the Lord, and even an invitation to come to his table (hence to be considered a member of his family).

While the Gospels do not give us this woman's name, I often ask for her intercession when I experience frustration and silence in prayer so that I may persevere in my prayers and that my heart may be open to the even greater gifts that our good Lord is preparing for those who wait on his word.

"I wait on the Lord, my soul waits, and in His word I hope; my soul waits for the Lord more than watchmen for the morning." Psalm 130:5-6

The Queenship of Mary Tuesday, August 22



Pope Pius XII established this feast in 1954. But the Blessed Virgin Mary's queenship has roots in Scripture. At the Annunciation, Gabriel announced that Mary's Son would receive the throne of David and rule forever. At the Visitation, Elizabeth calls Mary "mother of my Lord." As in all the myster-

ies of Mary's life, she is closely associated with Jesus: Her queenship is a share in Jesus' kingship. We can also recall that in the Old Testament the mother of the king has great influence in court.

In the fourth century Saint Ephrem called Mary "Lady" and "Queen." Later Church fathers and doctors continued to use the title. Hymns of the 11th to 13th centuries address Mary as queen: "Hail, Holy Queen," "Hail, Queen of Heaven," "Queen of Heaven." The Dominican rosary and the Franciscan crown as well as numerous invocations in Mary's litany celebrate her queenship.

The feast is a logical follow-up to the Assumption, and is now celebrated on the octave day of that feast. In his 1954 encyclical *To the Queen of Heaven*, Pius XII points out that Mary deserves the title because she is Mother of God, because she is closely associated as the New Eve with Jesus' redemptive work, because of her preeminent perfection, and because of her intercessory power.


