Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Peter is an imperfect, problematic, very human person. Here he shows great faith and insight into the reality of who Jesus is, yet at the passion he will be the first to run away from the frightful scene and will repeatedly deny his connection to Christ. In this scene, he appears to earn his status as first among the disciples by giving the right answer to a tricky question. But in reality, his power and leadership are unearned gifts from God; Jesus even says that it is God who revealed this answer to Peter. Leadership in the church is not earned or deserved. All too often its leaders fail to live out the holiness to which we are all called. But because it is given by God, it still has some level of trustworthiness; the church is never left alone with the imperfection of solely human leadership.

To Experience: When church leadership fails us, it can often cause a crisis of faith. This is absolutely understandable, especially given the ways that we are often miscatechized about the relationship between power and holiness. But the leadership never really belonged to the imperfect humans who failed us. It is, in the end, God who gave the power and who promises to side with the lowly ones.

- Jesus tells his disciples not to share the truth that he is the Christ; there is a time and place to proclaim, and this is not it. We, too, need to exercise prudence in deciding when and where and how to talk about our faith. We are charged with spreading the good news, but there are times when our delivery would do more harm than good. How do you discern the right times and places to talk about Jesus?
- The second reading talks about God's ways being inscrutable and unsearchable. What do you currently find most confusing about God and how God works in the world?

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This weekend is the 169th anniversary of the founding of the village of St. Nazianz. The story is unique in the history of Catholicism in America. The original settlers were not seeking fortune or fame. Rather they had read the words of the Acts of the Apostles and were making a serious effort to put those words into practice.

> "Now the full number of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one said that any of the things that belonged to him was his own, but they had everything in common." Acts 4:32

Father Ambrose Oschwald, who led this group, was also the founder of Holy Trinity Parish in School Hill.

2. As we begin the month of September, I am already looking forward to the Feast of the Archangels, Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael, which is celebrated on September 29. For decades, the Catholic Church prayed the prayer of St. Michael after Mass. Pope Leo XIII asked for this prayer to be offered after Mass to prepare the members of the Church for spiritual battle. While not talked about as often now as it used to be, the Christian life is a life of spiritual combat. This theme is common in scripture, as this example from the letter to the Ephesians demonstrates:

"We do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Therefore, take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm. Éphesians 6:12-13

During the month of September, we will be praying the St. Michael Prayer at the end of Mass. It is found on the back cover of the Breaking Bread hymnal, and prayer cards will be distributed after Mass this weekend. I highly encourage you to pray this prayer daily.

There is a classic Catholic book called Spiritual Combat by Father Lorenzo Scupoli.

3. A few weeks ago, I wrote about the book, Living Joy: Nine Rules to Help Rediscover and Live Joy Every Day by Chris Stefanick. Enough people have asked about getting a copy of the book that a case of books was ordered. Catholic Market has a program that parishes can order certain books at a much-reduced cost. If you would like a copy, they will be available at Masses the first weekend in September. A donation of \$2 to \$3 to cover the cost is appreciated but is not necessary.




St. Nazianz Area Seven Church Pilgrimage



St. Augustine Monday, August 28



A Christian at 33, a priest at 36. a bishop at 41: Many people are familiar with the biographical sketch of Augustine of Hippo, sinner turned saint. But to get to really know the man is a rewarding experience.

There quickly surfaces the intensity with which he lived his life, whether his path led

away from or toward God. The tears of his mother, the instructions of Ambrose and, most of all. God himself speaking to him in the Scriptures, redirected Augustine's love of life to a life of love.

Having been so deeply immersed in creature-pride of life in his early days and having drunk deeply of its bitter dregs, it is not surprising that Augustine should have turned, with a holy fierceness, against the many demon-thrusts rampant in his day. His times were truly decadent: politically, socially, morally. He was both feared and loved, like the Master. The perennial criticism leveled against him: a fundamental riaorism.

In his day, Augustine providentially fulfilled the office of prophet. Like Jeremiah and other greats, he was hard-pressed but could not keep quiet. "I say to myself, I will not mention him/I will speak in his name no more/But then it becomes like fire burning in my heart/imprisoned in my bones/I grow weary holding it in/I cannot endure it" (Jeremiah 20:9).
