Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Our reactions to the leper in this story may be understandably mixed. On the one hand, he rewards Jesus' generosity with immediate disobedience, making Jesus' life harder. On the other hand, who could blame him? He has been seen and received and loved in a way his disease made impossible. Jesus' willingness to stop and hear him healed an ailment that should have been incurable. He has been the recipient of such love and such a wondrous gift that he cannot help but overflow in gratitude. When he approached Jesus to ask for healing, he likely was hoping to return to the life he had before the leprosy set in. He had been cast out from family and friends, from religious observance and social participation. But Jesus' healing disrupts all that. Instead of going to the priest and restoring his ritual cleanliness, he *has* to go out and preach what he has seen.

To Experience: The COVID-19 pandemic changed how we think about sickness. In some ways this was good—we were reminded of how connected we are and that our actions have a meaningful effect on others. But one result has sometimes been an over-moralizing of getting sick. Instead of responding to illness with compassion, many of us now wonder what that person did wrong to get sick. As we continue to heal from the pandemic, consider how you and your community might return to a place of compassion for those who are ill.

1. When is a time you felt that your plans had been disrupted by Jesus? How did you respond?
2. The leper's illness separated him from his community; what keeps you from living in full communion with yours? How might you ask Jesus to heal that?
3. The psalm reassures us that God is with us in troubled times and wants to bring us through them to a place of joy. What troubles do you need to bring to God right now? How can your community help you endure them?

Hear to Serve...

LORD, MAKE US CLEAN

Two weeks ago, I had the opportunity to be part of a presentation to our Confirmation Candidates about sexual morality. This is a topic that they have heard about before, but it is one that truly needs to be addressed many times because there is a war going on between Church teaching and what is being practiced in society. Since the sexual revolution of the 60's, we have become a sex-obsessed culture. While sexual immorality has existed since the beginning of time, our society is the first society in history that believes sexual freedom trumps all other moral laws. We like to believe that sexual freedom is subjective and personal; there is no absolute truth when it comes to sexual issues.

We know there is truth. In the beginning God created Adam and Eve in His Divine Image, male and female. God blessed them saying, "Be fertile and multiply, fill the earth and subdue it." This was the first marriage, this was God's Prime Directive to us, to be fruitful and multiply. It was a union of souls in communion with God.

But our society has turned sex into parade candy. Remember parades when we were young? As they went down the street people on the floats would throw candy out to everyone and anyone standing on the side. We would try to catch the candy, but so much of it landed on the street and in the gutter, where it become dirty, but it was still picked up and consumed. That is exactly what has become of the gift of sex from God. We made it dirty, but we still consume it.

Jesus has given us seven sacraments, seven life giving sacraments, seven ways to help us achieve the ultimate life with the Father. The sexual revolution and organizations like Planned Parenthood have also given us a sacrament, a sacrament of death called abortion.

There is a growing number of people in this country that view abortion as "reproductive health care." Abortion is often treated as backup contraception, and all contraception in any form is allowing us to have sex without the responsibility of having children. We know it is nothing but pure and simple murder. When we use contraceptives, when we partake in abortion, we are going against God's Prime Directive for us, when we kill babies in the womb and we are also killing off our immortal souls. Worst of all, we are attacking God Himself.

The sexual revolution, contraception, and abortion are destroying the very core of our society, the family. A stable, faithful family is the bedrock that holds society together. God designed marriage and the family to be the primary way to keep us from our natural tendency to be self-centered. Marriage teaches us to be self-giving to another, to society, and to God. Marriage teaches us to be open to giving and nurturing life.

If you think I have sounded harsh, you're probably right, but our society has twisted what God has planned for us, for our bodies. We have personally attacked God, and we have committed murder all in the name of personal freedom.

The Good News is that Jesus Christ wants to heal us. Jesus offers us mercy and salvation through the life giving sacrament of Confession if we choose. There is no sin that we cannot repent of and ask forgiveness for. There is no sin greater than the power of Jesus Christ.

Let us follow the advice of St. Paul and "Do everything for the glory of God." Let us pray that our young people learn the life-giving values of the Church. Let us pray for strong marriages that are fruitful. Let us pray for those who have had abortions that they may repent and be restored to life. And let us remember the leper in today's gospel and ask to be healed from everything that keeps us from God's eternal love and life. "Lord, if you wish, you can make me clean."

Lectio Divina — Praying with Scripture

This ancient tradition is a beautiful way of praying with the Bible and is critical to the New Evangelization, so that our members are energized continuously on the word of God, both at Mass and also in our own personal or group prayer.

The *Lectio Divina* Process

1. *Lectio* — Reading

- Select a passage from Scripture.
- Read through the passage a few times and allow the words to capture your attention and your being. In this way, begin to listen as God speaks to your heart.

2. *Meditatio* — Meditation

- During this phase, seek to acquire the mind of Christ and learn what he wants to reveal to you.
- As you read, certain words, phrases or even thoughts might have jumped out at you. Take some time during this stage to consider why these phrases and words might have jumped out at you.
- Imagine yourself as an observer in the Scripture passage, reflecting on what you see, hear, taste, touch and to what and whom you are drawn to.
- Consider how the words relate to your life today. At the end of your prayer, stop writing and speaking. Focus on the Lord, rest in him and enjoy being close to him in love.

3. *Oratio* — Praying

- During this phase, pray from your heart and respond to what Jesus has spoken to you in the holy words of Scripture.
- Allow the grace of these words, images and thoughts to move you to a heartfelt prayer.
- Ask Jesus personally for help, guidance, insight and direction. Find yourself talking to him naturally.

4. *Contemplatio* — Contemplation

- During this time, find yourself resting with and in the Lord. Rest in his presence so that the very core of your being is stilled.
- Center your attention on God.
- Allow the word of God to stir within you the courage, strength, energy and guidance for a fresh start and a new beginning.

- Pray the Examen at the end of your day
- Read the Gospel of Mark for ten minutes each day

- Do not eat meat on an additional weekday
- Eat one less meal
- Set a daily timer for Facebook or your favorite social media fix
- Don't buy anything extra except food
- Don't watch TV (or Hulu, Netflix, or Amazon Prime)

- Do not swear or gossip

St. Gregory Parish Boiler Project Update 2/4/2024

Jan. 30—Schnell Electric began to install the permanent wiring for the new boilers and associated equipment. They also installed new lighting in the area around the boilers. Schnell Electric completed this work as a donation to St. Gregory Parish.

Feb. 2—Members of the Building and Grounds committee received training on the operation of the new boilers from an employee of McCotter Energy Systems, located in Milwaukee, WI. McCotter is a distributor of Riello Boilers (the brand we selected) and offers phone assistance or onsite support as well as a complete inventory of every repair part our new boilers may need. We also have as our first line of help, Mannenbach Mechanical from Kiel.

Feb. 6—Chardon Labs, a water treatment company, came and evaluated the water in the boiler hot water system. Chemicals were added to the system as needed to protect the new boilers as well as all the piping used to heat the two buildings, including the copper piping in the floor of the church. This testing and treatment will continue into the future.
