Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Many of us think of Advent as a peacefully prayerful time. The idea of "keeping vigil" is appealing and cozy: shortened days draw us inside, where lights dim and candles flicker while we renew our devotion to prayer. But the first Sunday of Advent always has an edge to it. Jesus' reminders to stay vigilant are not gentle ones. He warns that his return to earth will assault everyone one who lives here. People are going to die of fright at the cosmic signs of the eschaton. Jesus' return will be a source of great joy, but it is also going to change the world as we know it. No matter how well we purify our desires, all of us will suffer some loss in the process. This is the vigilance Jesus calls us to: detachment from the things of this world so that we will be ready to leave them behind when the time comes.

To Experience: In the gospel, Jesus names the anxieties of daily life as one of the things that can make our hearts too drowsy to be ready for him. This might be surprising—he places these anxieties alongside carousing and drunkenness, which take a more active choice to partake in and are therefore easier to avoid. Anxiety is tricky. It can make us *feel* like it's helping us prepare. It keeps us vigilant. But it is distracting and unproductive, miring us down instead of setting us free. Jesus calls us to vigilance, yes, but not at the expense of the peace he promises.

1. What might you need to detach from in order to be better prepared for Jesus' coming? How can you make more space for him in your heart?
2. How can you balance the vigilance God asks from us with trust in God's goodness, love, and desire to save all of us?
3. How could you "lift your soul" to God this week? How might you carve out a little space of stillness so that you can listen to God's loving voice?

Hear to Serve

DO YOU HAVE WHAT IT TAKES TO BE A GODPARENT OR A SPONSOR?

One of the most beautiful traditions in the Catholic Church is Godparents. The role of a godparent is one of great responsibility. A godparent assists the parents in making sure that the child is living a life that will get that child to heaven. Godparents, even though may not directly teach the child, must set an example for the child of living out the Catholic Faith, of living a holy life. Being a Godparent is not a social award in the Catholic Church. Therefore, there are qualifications to be a Godparent.

Usually there are two godparents for Baptism, but you only need one. When there are two, you must have one male and one female. Henceforth the terms Godmother and Godfather. A godparent must be over the age of 16.

There are situations where sometimes one of the persons asked is not Catholic. That person is called a Christian Witness, and they must have been baptized with Baptism that conforms with a Catholic Baptism.

All Catholics who are asked to be godparents need to be in full communion with the Catholic Church which means they have been baptized; they have received the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Communion; they have to have been Confirmed. If they are married, they have to have been married in the Catholic Church, or have gotten permission from the Bishop for other arrangements. Catholics who are not married may not be "living together."

A Confirmation sponsor has the same requirements as that of a Catholic godparent. The sponsor must have received all Sacraments of Initiation and be an example of living out the sacramental Catholic life. The role of the Confirmation sponsor is to walk with the Confirmand in living a life firmly rooted in the Catholic faith.

Sometimes people we love and respect do not meet the qualifications of godparent or sponsor. This is not meant to be harsh or exclusionary. Like I said, this isn't a social award. Being a godparent or sponsor is about helping someone through the pitfalls of the world and being a living example of the Catholic life. We cannot expect a person to do all of this if they are not living their own life in a Catholic way. **These rules are Canon Law.** They are laws that a parish, deacon, priest, and bishop must follow.

I am bringing this up to avoid confusion and hurt feelings. In the past, things may have slipped by, or the right questions were not asked. It is important for parents to know the qualifications before asking someone to be a godparent to their child. It is also important for all of us to know what is required of us to be a godparent or sponsor.

Now, if you find yourself short on sacraments, do not dismay! If you have not received the Sacrament of Confirmation or if you do not have a sacramental marriage, or any other sacrament, these things can be fixed. Call your parish office, talk to Father Joshua, or talk to me. The Church is happy to make sure you receive the graces given by the sacraments.

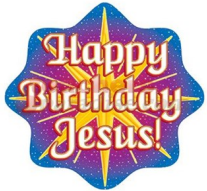

St. Nicholas Feast Day: December 6

When is St. Nicholas Day?

St. Nicholas Day is celebrated on December 6. In 2024, this is on a Friday.

Who is St. Nicholas?

St. Nicholas was a bishop of an ancient Greek town called Myra, in present-day Turkey. He may have attended the first Council of Nicaea, where he is rumored to have punched Arius, a heretic, in the face. He was born around March 15, 270 and died on December 6, 343.

St. Nicholas always had a love for the poor and would work for their benefit. The story goes that there

was a poor man in town with no money for a dowry for his daughters. No dowry meant no marriage, which would have left his daughters to be sold into a life of servitude. Late one night, St. Nicholas dropped a bag of money down the chimney of the family home, thus allowing the daughters a dowry.

Most famously, he is the real-life historical figure from whom we get Santa Claus. His generosity inspired the "chubby and plump, a right jolly old elf" - *Santa* meaning *Saint* and *Claus* is short for *Nicholas*.

St. Nicholas Day Traditions

On December 5, the eve of St. Nicholas Day, children traditionally leave a shoe or a boot in front of the fireplace. The next morning the shoe is filled with small gifts, like coins, candy and oranges. The coins are given in remembrance of the coins St. Nicholas left the girls in need of a dowry and oranges are given to signify the gold that St. Nicholas gave away to those in need. This tradition comes from the legends of St. Nicholas' generosity and led to the celebration of Santa Claus on Christmas Day today. In some countries, like Germany and

Austria, St. Nicholas is accompanied by his counterpart the Krampus. Much like the legend of Santa Claus, the Krampus will leave coal in the shoes of misbehaving children. Children are encouraged to participate in acts of kindness to stay off of the Krampus' naughty list. In some countries people begin St. Nicholas Day celebrations with a parade. Many end their day with a celebratory meal. And since St. Nicholas is the patron saint of unmarried women, in Italy it's not just children who receive gifts.

One fun way to celebrate is to make traditional St. Nicholas cookies. In the United States gingerbread and sugar cookies are the most popular while in countries such as the Netherlands and Germany make spice cookies and peppermint cookies. The spice cookies are made into the shape of St. Nicholas - complete with a Bishop's miter and staff!

Another tradition that is observed is to perform random acts of kindness on St. Nicholas' feast day. You could drop off a grocery store gift card to those in need, give books to your parish to use at Christmas, anonymously pay the utility bill of someone in need or donate gifts to local foster care programs. Spend time as a family brainstorming what you can do to serve your community just as St. Nicholas did when he was alive.

Who is St. Nicholas the Patron Saint of?

A patron saint is a saint who is known for praying for and helping people in specific walks of life or particular circumstances. Saints are typically patron saints of people, things and situations that were similar to experiences they had when they were alive.

St. Nicholas is the patron saint of children, bakers, brides, unmarried women, grooms, sailors and travelers. Because he was persecuted for his faith we can pray for all people who are being persecuted around the world. He was a Bishop, so we can ask him to intercede for bishops. And he helped the poor, sick and suffering, so we can ask him to pray for those most in need in our communities.

The story of St. Nicholas is fun to know and a great way to remind us and our kids that Christmas is about more than just presents.
