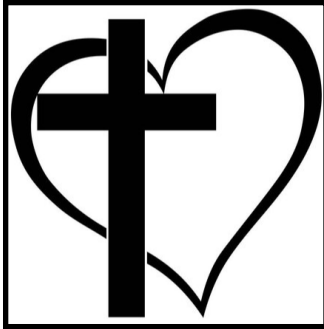

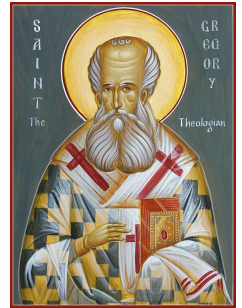
Parish News

The Holy Relic of St. Gregory of Nazianzus

In honor of St. Gregory of Nazianzus's feast day (January 2), a holy relic is displayed at the front of church. St. Gregory, an eastern saint, is best known for his teachings of the Trinity. The relic is on loan from Holy Resurrection Monastery.



What is a Relic?

Relics include the physical remains of a saint (or of a person who is considered holy but not yet officially canonized) as well as other objects which have been "sanctified" by being touched to his body. These relics are divided into two classes: First class or real relics include the physical body parts, clothing, and instruments connected with a martyr's imprisonment, torture, and execution. Second class or representative relics are those which the faithful have touched to the physical body parts or grave of the saint. Relics remind us of the holiness of a saint and his cooperation in God's work; at the same time, relics inspire us to ask for the prayers of that saint and to beg the grace of God to live the same kind a faith-filled life.

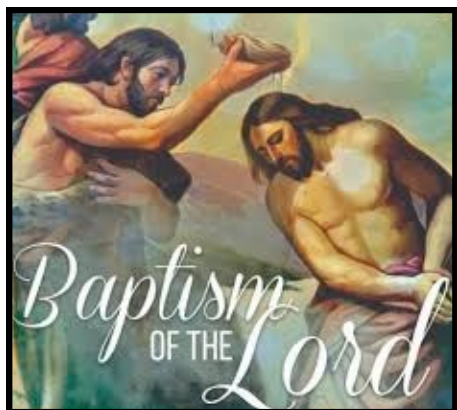
Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: When Jesus is baptized, he does not need its cleansing aspect. He is free from sin and does not need the repentance that John's baptism signified. At Jesus' baptism, he adds a dimension to the practice, elevating it from human devotional practice to sacrament of God's grace. Baptism still signifies repentance and is still cleansing; it removes the stain of original sin and restores us to right relationship with God. It is *also*, now, the means by which God adopts us as children and coheirs with Christ. Although it may not be as clear as in this gospel story, at all our baptisms, the heavens open, the Spirit descends, and God declares us beloved children in whom God is well pleased.

To Experience: For those of us were baptized as infants, it can be challenging to claim our baptismal identity. While infant baptism is a good thing, affirming the humanity and belovedness of the youngest among us, it is challenging that the most important day of our lives is lost in our memories. It can be fruitful to hear the testimony of adult converts, who chose baptism more freely and who made their own vows to follow Christ.

1. Share something about the last baptism you attended. Recall how you saw God present there.
2. What does your baptismal identity mean to you? How do you live out the vows that you made (or your parents made on your behalf) at your baptism?
3. How do you experience God's ongoing work of creative restoration? How can you partner with God in renewing the world and infusing it with beauty and goodness?

Dear Friends in Christ,

This Sunday, we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, commemorating Jesus' baptism in the Jordan River by John the Baptist. This significant event marks the beginning of Jesus' public ministry and serves as a profound reminder of our own baptismal promises.

In the first reading, the prophet Isaiah proclaims a message of comfort and hope, announcing the coming of the Lord who will shepherd His people with care. This reading reminds us that through baptism, we are brought into a relationship with God, who lovingly guides and strengthens us on our journey.

St. Paul, in today's second reading, reminds us that the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all. Through the waters of baptism, we are reborn and renewed by the Holy Spirit, called to live upright and godly lives while awaiting the blessed hope of eternal life.

In the Gospel, we hear of Jesus' baptism, where the heavens open, the Holy Spirit descends like a dove, and the voice of the Father declares, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." This event highlights the transformative power of baptism, calling us to live as beloved children of God.

As we reflect on these readings, let us renew our commitment to our baptismal promises:

Reject Sin: Turn away from anything that separates us from God's love.

Embrace Grace: Live as people transformed by the saving grace of Jesus Christ.

Be a light to others: Share the love and mercy of Christ with everyone we encounter.

May this feast enkindle in us the joy of our baptism and inspire us to live out our faith with hope, love, and service.
