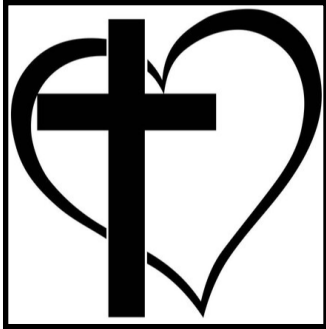

The Presentation of the Lord and the Sacred Act of Offering

Dear Friends in Christ,

In the Gospel, we see Mary and Joseph presenting the infant Jesus in the temple after 40 days of his birth, fulfilling the Jewish law. As part of this sacred moment, they offer "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons," a humble sacrifice prescribed for those unable to afford a lamb. This offering, though simple, was filled with deep devotion, gratitude, and obedience to God's covenant. It reminds us that every gift we present to God carries the intention of our hearts and reflects our faith.

This act of offering finds a striking parallel in the beautiful traditions of Indian Christian communities, especially in Tamil Nadu. During the offertory in the Holy Mass, families bring gifts such as rice, eggs, vegetables, and other items, presenting them with great reverence to the priest. In some special occasions, families offer a goat or a cock as an offering to God for His providence. These offerings symbolize the fruits of their labor, their gratitude for God's blessings, and their commitment to the Church.

In many parishes, these offerings are brought to the altar, where the priest blesses them. Afterward, they are used to support the needs of the Church or distributed to the poor, demonstrating the communal aspect of faith and the call to share our blessings with others. Just as Mary and Joseph offered Jesus in the temple, the faithful today present their gifts to God as a sign of their love and dedication.

This sacred tradition is not about the material value of the offering but the spirit in which it is given. Whether it is two doves, a lamb, even a small portion of rice, what matters is the heart that offers it. These gifts remind us that all we have comes from God, and returning a portion to Him is an act of thanksgiving and trust in His providence.

As we reflect on the Presentation of the Lord, let us be inspired by Mary and Joseph's humility and obedience. Let us also honor the heritage of our faith through our own acts of offering. May every gift we present—whether material or spiritual—be a reflection of our gratitude, love, and faithfulness to God. Through these sacred customs, we are not just giving something to God; we are giving ourselves.

Thoughts for Today's Readings



To the Point: Simeon and Anna see parents consecrate their firstborns to God every day. On this day, though, these paired prophets know they are witnessing something unique. And their words amaze Mary and Joseph. Even though Jesus' parents have experienced angelic messengers and know their child is someone unique, their knowledge of his role in salvation history is still unfolding. Although their words are still mysterious, these prophets help these bewildered new parents begin to understand God's will for their little family. This is probably overwhelming, even more so than the normal burdens and bewilderment of new parenthood. But Mary and Joseph receive these prophecies in faith, Mary adds them to what she will ponder in her heart, and they continue on their journey with God.

To Experience: This feast is traditionally when candles are blessed for the remainder of the year, hence its other name of "Candlemas". In the medieval world, this date, when Mary reentered public life after giving birth, was also the end of the forty-day season of Christmastide. Christmas and the Presentation bookend the darkest time of the year—by now we can feel the days getting longer. It is no surprise, then, that light figures prominently into both. Candles and Christmas lights remind us that Jesus is light of the world, dispelling sin and darkness and guiding us to our eternal rest in God.

1. What sacred spaces help bring God to life for you? Where do you go to hear God's word?
2. Simeon and Anna help Mary and Joseph begin to understand the unique role their child will play in salvation history. Who helps you hear God's call in your own life?
3. The last line of the longer version of the gospel is all that we have in this gospel about Jesus' childhood and upbringing. Where do you find God in the everyday realities of your life?

**St. Gregory Financial Update
February 2025**

Dear Parishioners,

As of the end of December 2024, we are halfway through our financial year, which runs from July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025. We would like to provide a mid-year update to keep you informed.

Through December, we are on solid financial ground. On the revenue side, the first annual craft fair provided the parish with a new income stream and showed a profit of \$2,596. Better than planned! Our Fall Feast/Raffle made a profit of \$14,655 which was \$2,500 above the budgeted amount. So, thank you to the many volunteers and participants who made both events a great success.

Our parish support (envelopes, loose collections, donations) is currently at 95% of the budget through December. This is a significant improvement compared to last year at this time. Thank you everyone for your generosity!

So, while the parish support revenue is just a little under the budget, we have been able to keep our costs in line. For example, our Lay staff and contractors, (custodial, cleaning, lawn care, snow removal, etc.) costs are currently running at 86% of budget through December.

With those savings, the overages on our fundraisers, and the strong parish support we are currently in the black through December.

While this is fantastic news, we still need your continued support to keep on track and finish the year in the black. Mother nature is always a strong variable. If the winter gets harsh and snowy, we will see a significant increase in heating and snow removal costs. If spring brings a strong growing season, we will see an increase in lawn care costs. So, it is important that the financial support you provide for the last 6 months of the fiscal year is equal to or greater than what was generously shared throughout the first 6 months. We also have a critical fundraiser coming up in June, the Spring Fling Golf Outing and Raffle, and support will be needed for that as well.

If you have any questions, please ask a Finance Council member. We are listed in the bottom right corner on the cover of the bulletin. Or please feel free to attend a Finance council meeting, held on the 2nd Tuesday of each month at 6:00pm in the parish center cafeteria. Also, meeting minutes are published each month and available on the church entrance bulletin boards. Our next update will be at the annual meeting in October (date to be announced).

**The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord
February 2**

The Story of the Presentation of the Lord

At the end of the fourth century, a woman named Etheria made a pilgrimage to Jerusalem. Her journal, discovered in 1887, gives an unprecedented glimpse of liturgical life there. Among the celebrations she describes is the Epiphany, the observance of Christ's birth, and the gala procession in honor of his Presentation in the Temple 40 days later. Under the Mosaic Law, a woman was ritually "unclean" for 40 days after childbirth, when she was to present herself to the priests and offer sacrifice—her "purification."

Contact with anyone who had brushed against mystery—birth or death—excluded a person from Jewish worship. This feast emphasizes Jesus' first appearance in the Temple more than Mary's purification.

The observance spread throughout the Western Church in the fifth and sixth centuries. Because the Church in the West celebrated Jesus' birth on December 25, the Presentation was moved to February 2, 40 days after Christmas.

At the beginning of the eighth century, Pope Sergius inaugurated a candlelight procession; at the end of the same century the blessing and distribution of candles which continues to this day became part of the celebration, giving the feast its popular name: Candlemas.

Reflection

In Luke's account, Jesus was welcomed in the temple by two elderly people, Simeon and the widow Anna. They embody Israel in their patient expectation; they acknowledge the infant Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah. Early references to the Roman feast dub it the feast of Saint Simeon, the old man who burst into a song of joy which the Church still sings at day's end.

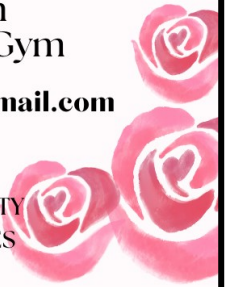

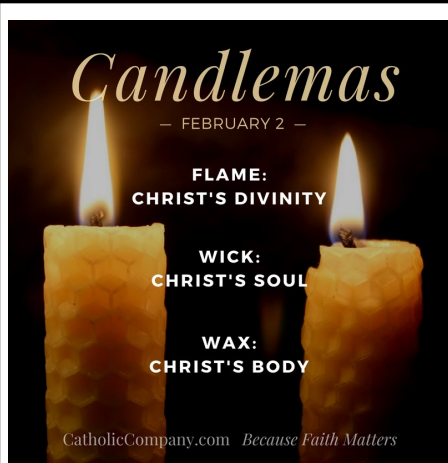
