Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: In this gospel, Jesus preaches the importance of being careful with our trust. Many voices claim to offer spiritual leadership (now more than ever with the rise of influencer culture), but many of these do not see clearly enough to act as trustworthy guides. It is, of course, unrealistic to find a human teacher who is without sin or who will be perfect at all times. But Jesus offers us a parameter for discerning a good teacher: "every tree is known by its own fruit." When we find that someone's life and teaching bear good fruit, we can be reasonably confident that their heart is also good—and that God is at work in them.

To Experience: It is often easy to get caught up in relationships that are fun or attractive but which do not bear good fruit for our spiritual lives. Sometimes even good people can draw out the worst in each other, falling into patterns of exclusivity or unkindness as a form of amusement. Such relationships are not bearing good fruit and will not ultimately sustain us through the challenges of Christian life.

1. What relationships bring you closer to God? What fruits do they bear that help you know God is near?
2. When our vision is distorted, we cannot see clearly. What "beams" might be in your eye, keeping you from seeing the truth of who God is?
3. The image of being a thriving, fruit-bearing tree runs through the readings today. What fruits might God be calling you to bear?

Seeing Clearly with the Heart of Christ

Dear Friends in Christ,

In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus offers us profound wisdom on discipleship, self-awareness, and the fruitfulness of our lives. He begins with a simple yet striking question: "Can a blind person guide a blind person?" This reminds us that before we attempt to correct or lead others, we must first ensure that our own vision is clear. The plank in our own eyes must be removed before we can help our brothers and sisters with their splinters. This is a call to humility - recognizing our own faults before pointing out the fallings of others.

Jesus then speaks of a disciple not being above the teacher. This teaches us that we are all lifelong learners in faith. We must constantly seek to be formed by Christ, allowing His wisdom to shape us. Only when we imitate the Master can we be effective in guiding others. Finally, Jesus gives us the image of a tree and its fruit: "A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit." Our words and actions are the natural outflow of what fills our hearts. If our hearts are full of love, faith, and mercy, our lives will reflect those virtues. But if our hearts are filled with bitterness, pride, or judgment, that too will be evident.

This passage calls us to examine our hearts: Are we truly rooted in Christ? Are we nurturing our spiritual lives so that we bear good fruit? As we gather in faith each week, let us allow Christ to open our eyes, transform our hearts, and guide us to be beacons of His light in the world.

May our words, actions, and lives reflect the goodness of the One who teaches us!

What to Give Up & Take Up During Lent**

Ideas for Prayer

- Count your daily gratefuls in the shower or on the drive to work
- Go to daily Mass an extra day or two outside of Sunday
- Pray the Angelus at 12 p.m.
- Pray the Rosary as a family, or Pray the Rosary in your car by yourself
- Pray the Examen at the end of your day
- Read the Gospel of Mark for ten minutes each day

Ideas for Fasting

- Do not eat meat on an additional weekday
- Eat one less meal
- Set a daily timer for Facebook or your favorite social media fix
- Don't buy anything extra except food
- Don't watch TV (or Hulu, Netflix, or Amazon Prime)
- Turn off the radio in the car
- Eat more simply
- Give up caffeine or limit yourself to one cup of coffee each day
- Do not swear or gossip

Ideas for Almsgiving

- Do not use your credit card during Lent, only pay with cash
- Give up downloading apps, games, or music to your phone
- If you like texting or talking on the phone, write more letters
- Make a meal for an elderly neighbor
- Show an act of kindness to a family member/friend/stranger each day
- Give up complaining, take up gratitude instead
- Give up online shopping

Mass Changes Effective March 8 & 9

A new process will be followed for the presentation of gifts and for the commentators. This will begin during the Lenten season:

Presentation Gifts – Greeters will be responsible for asking parishioners to bring up gifts but may do it themselves if they wish. Presenters will be bringing gifts up at the same time ushers go up to begin their collection. Once collection is complete, an usher may bring the basket to the sanctuary without handing it to Father or Deacon.

Commentators will remain in the back of church until about a minute before Mass begins. They will then proceed to the front of church, make the announcements, and then return to the back of church for the procession. If they choose to they are welcome to return to their seats after the reading and/or intentions are complete or they may stay in the sanctuary. If preferred, they may remain in their seats until it is time for the reading.

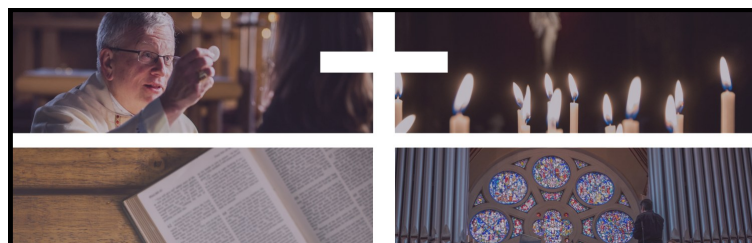
Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion Training
