

Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Two weeks ago, we celebrated Pentecost, remembering that God remains with us in the gift of the Holy Spirit. This week, we remember another way that God remains with us—in the Eucharist, where Jesus' very body and blood are really present. The gospel chosen for this feast could have been the institution narrative, but instead we have a moment from earlier in Jesus' life that foreshadows the Eucharist. In this episode, Jesus follows the same "take, bless, break, and give" pattern that he will follow at the Last Supper and that we continue to follow at every Mass. In it, all those present find their fill, and God's superabundance assures there is much more food that what the gathered people needed.

To Experience: Food is nourishment for our bodies, and it also carries with it an enormous amount of tradition and culture. Treating food strictly as fuel is often unsustainable, because we are not robots who need power. Taking pleasure in food is a deeply human thing. Food is both something our bodies need and, often, something that feeds our hearts. Jesus makes even more of this, offering his very body as food that nourishes and sustains our souls as we journey through the Christian life.

- 1. What has the Eucharist meant to you at different points on your journey of faith?
- 2. As human beings, we are made up of body and soul, and God cares for and nourishes both of these. How do you find your physical health impacting your spiritual well-being and viceversa?
- 3. Jesus cares for us using the stuff of real life, normal food and drink. How do you use food to care for others?

Corpus Christi Offering What We Are and Have

As we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, we are reminded dur-

ing the offertory of a powerful truth: "Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the bread we offer you: fruit of the earth and work of human hands..."

This simple but profound prayer echoes the three great truths found in today's readings:

From the earth: Like Melchizedek in Genesis, we bring bread and wine as signs of God's providence. They represent all creation - what the earth gives us in abundance.


From the vine: As Jesus breaks the bread and feeds the multitude in the Gospel, we witness how God takes what we offer and multiplies it, transforming ordinary gifts into extraordinary grace.

From Human hands: In the second reading, St. Paul recounts the institution of the Eucharist, showing us that Jesus chose simple elements and entrusted them to the Church. What we bring through human effort, Christ receives and returns as His very Body and Blood.

The Eucharist is not only what we receive - it is also what we offer. Every Mass invites us to bring the fruit of the earth, the work of our hands, and even the brokenness of our hearts. Christ, in return, gives us the fullness of His divine love.

As we approach the altar today, may we truly offer ourselves - with all our work, joys, and struggles - and allow Christ to make us into bread blessed, broken, and shared for the life of the world.

SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS

Friday, June 27

5 Facts about the feast of corpus christi

- The Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, or Corpus Christi, celebrates the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.
- There were 2 separate miracles that lead to the institution of the feast in the Catholic Church: A Vision to St. Juliana of Mont Cornillon and The Miracle at Bolsena.

St. Juliana's Vision: The saint had a vision of the Church under the appearance of a full moon which had one dark spot. During the vision, she heard a mysterious, heavenly voice explain that the moon represented the Church at that time, and the dark spot symbolized the fact that a great feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament was missing from the liturgical calendar.

The Miracle at Bolsena: In 1263 a priest had grown lukewarm for his love of the Eucharist and began to doubt Jesus' true presence in the Blessed Sacrament. In response to his doubt, when he recited the prayer of consecration as he celebrated the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, blood started seeping from the consecrated host and onto the altar and corporal.

- The festival was instituted throughout the Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. Before that there had been no universal festival to mark the Sacrament of the Eucharist.
- Inspired by the St. Juliana and The Miracle at Bolsena, Pope Urban IV commissioned St. Thomas Aquinas to compose the Mass and Office for the feast of Corpus Christi. Namely, Pange Lingua, Tantum Ergo, Panis Angelicus, and O Salutaris Hostia.
- 5. One of the key liturgical facets of Corpus Christi is its procession. They enable Christians to give public witness to their faith, give glory to God, and they symbolize our earthly pilgrimage to the heavenly Jerusalem. Eucharistic processions began shortly after the institution of the Feast of Corpus Christi.

Lax Chapel 1875—2025 Celebrating 150 Years

Built in 1875 by Frank Lax, who had come to the United States from his native Bohemia in 1870 seeking a better life for himself and his family. With him, he brought a small statue of Our Lady of Loucim, an image of Mary dating to 1400 in Bohemia. About five years later, Frank became ill. Remembering the image of Mary from his homeland, he promised to build a chapel for the statue if he got well. He did and he fulfilled his promise. The present chapel was rebuilt in 1910. The chapel drew visitors and, since Frank's day, there has been an annual Mass celebrated there on July 4.


