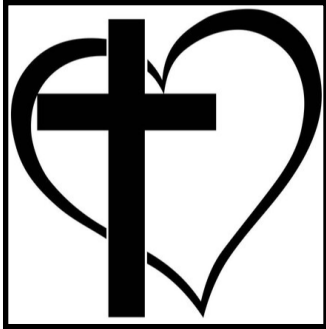

### Thoughts for Today's Readings

**To the Point:** Peter is such a fascinating character because his commitment to Jesus does not come all at once. Like most of us, his journey with Christ involves ups and downs, fits and starts. He recklessly drops his fishing career to follow Jesus. He answers this question about Jesus' identity correctly and becomes a leader among the apostles. Right after this episode, he is rebuked by Jesus for not wanting to accept the suffering and death of his Lord. He ends up denying Jesus, then responding again to his shoreline call after the resurrection. Whenever we stumble in our faithfulness, we might look to Peter as an example. In the end, his encounter with the Risen Christ enables him to replace cowardice with courage. He becomes a bold preacher of the divine work he has seen, insisting on bringing this message to people who don't want to hear it. He will continue to do so through persecution and imprisonment, until finally he follows Jesus all the way to the cross.

**To Experience:** Like Peter and Paul, we might be called to some amount of suffering for Christ's sake. Jesus did, after all, tell us all to take up our crosses if we would be his disciples. We are not called to seek out unnecessary suffering, but when pain inadvertently finds us, we can rest in the knowledge that Jesus has conquered it. It is no longer suffering for its own sake, we do not hurt in vain. When we join our suffering with Christ's he can transform it into something life-giving and good.

1. For Peter, following Christ does not happen all at once. He has ups and downs on his journey with Jesus but eventually grows into a courageous and faithful leader. Where are you on your own faith journey? How do you find God present with you in this season, whatever it is?
2. What suffering have you had to endure for the sake of your faith? How has Jesus helped you get through it?

## Hear to Serve

### A Story of Hope

*"We even boast of our afflictions,  
knowing that affliction produces endurance,  
and endurance, proven character,  
and proven character, hope,  
and hope does not disappoint"  
(Romans 5:4)*

My sister-in-law was losing her sight to cataracts. She had heavy scarring on her eyes from a corneal ulcer which made surgery impossible. For years, her vision deteriorated, and the lenses of her glasses got thicker. All of this was made worse by weak muscles causing double vision.

Being a woman of faith, she was determined to enjoy every moment of sight she had left. She would take pictures of the sunset and of her grandchildren and enlarge them so that she could see details. When she felt overwhelmed, frightened, or angry she would pray. She kept candles lit as a reminder that God was present with her, and she knew he would help her endure whatever was to come. She felt drawn to Our Lady of Champion and visited the shrine, anointed her eyes with holy oil and asked for Our Lady's intercession. She asked that she would be able to have surgery to remove the cataracts.

At an eye appointment this winter, she was told that she needed an even stronger prescription. A month later, when she tried on her new glasses, her vision was even worse with them on. The doctor examined her again and found something he could not explain. The scarring that had been on her eyes was gone. Sometime during that month, her prayers were answered. After receiving the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, she had surgery to remove the cataracts.

This woman who was legally blind now has 20/20 vision in both eyes. What a miracle! The double vision remains but she will be the first to tell you that there is hope for that, too. This summer all of us are making a pilgrimage to Champion where my sister-in-law will leave the pair of glasses she never had to wear as a testimony that God does hear our prayers and he always answers them.

I cannot explain the Mystery of the Most Holy Trinity, but I am so grateful for His love and for the gifts of life and forgiveness. His promise to always be with us gives us hope...and hope does not disappoint.

### Lax Chapel

1875—2025

*Celebrating 150 Years*



Built in 1875 by Frank Lax, who had come to the United States from his native Bohemia in 1870 seeking a better life for himself and his family. With him, he brought a small statue of Our Lady of Loucim, an image of Mary dating to 1400 in Bohemia. About five years later, Frank became ill. Remembering the image of Mary from his homeland, he promised to build a chapel for the statue if he got well. He did and he fulfilled his promise. The present chapel was re-built in 1910. The chapel drew visitors and, since Frank's day, there has been an annual Mass celebrated there on July 4.
