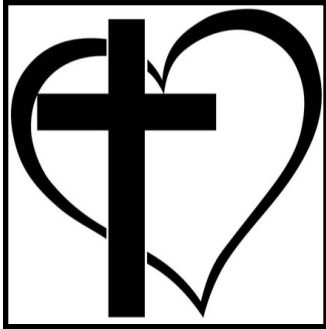

Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: In this gospel, Jesus sends disciples out to places he intends to visit. They are given a share in Jesus' power for their preparatory mission. They are sent to preach and to heal and to seek out places that will be open to Jesus' presence. They go with nothing but each other, instructed not to bring the usual things that make travel more comfortable but rather to rely on the hospitality of those they will encounter. Their ministry is not one-directional; they bring something the people need but they also arrive in need of their generosity. Their need enables them to enter into a transformative relationship, the kind where God can get to work on hearts and minds.

To Experience: God does not call most of us to minister in such a radically simple way as these seventy-two disciples. But God does call us to bring Jesus' words and healing to the world. God calls us to minister within the context of relationship. And God calls us to detach from worldly things and place our trust in God alone.

1. Jesus sends his disciples to prepare his way in pairs. With whom do you travel through this life? Who accompanies you on your faith journey?
2. What labor does God call you to in this season of your life?
3. Jesus instructs his disciples to travel without even the basic comforts of travel; they are to rely instead on the hospitality of strangers. Where could you detach from some comfort in order to realize more fully your dependence on God?

Dear Friends in Christ,

In the Gospel of this weekend, Jesus appoints seventy-two disciples and sends them out in pairs to every town He intended to visit. He gives them simple instructions: carry no money bag, no sandals, no extra burdens - just go. Their task is to bring peace, heal the sick, and announce that "the Kingdom of God is at hand for you."

This mission is not only for the seventy-two; it is also for us. Jesus still sends disciples into the world - into homes, workplaces, schools, and communities. He sends us not with material wealth or persuasive words, but with the power of simplicity, peace, and genuine witness.

Three key reflections we need to think about:

1. The mission is urgent.
"The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few." Jesus is not waiting for perfect people - He calls willing ones. The world is aching for hope, peace, and healing. Are we ready to say yes?
2. We are sent with nothing but Christ.
Jesus tells them to travel light - not because things are bad, but because clinging to too much can slow down the mission. In our age of distractions and noise, we are reminded that we are most effective when we rely on God, not our own strength.
3. True success is spiritual.
When the disciples return with joy, Jesus redirects their excitement. It's not the miracles or accomplishments that matter most - but that "your names are written in heaven." Our value lies not in what we do, but in our belonging to God.

Living the Gospel in Our Society:

- Greet each person with peace - not just with words, but through actions of respect and kindness.
- Be a healing presence - listen to the wounded, forgive those who hurt you, support the forgotten.
- Proclaim the Kingdom - not by preaching alone, but by living in a way that shows God is real, present, and loving.
- Be available to be sent - in your family, in the parish, in service to the poor, or in outreach to the lonely.

We are not just followers of Christ; we are also His messengers. Let us go joyfully and humbly to be His presence in the world.

Mass Intention for Loved Ones

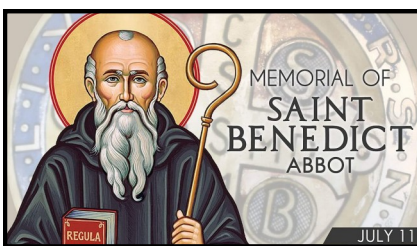

Saint Benedict's Story Feast Day: July 11

Saint Benedict is the Patron Saint of:

Europe
Kidney Disease
Monastics
Poisoning
Schoolchildren

It is unfortunate that no contemporary biography was written of a man who has exercised the greatest influence on monasticism in the West. Benedict is well recognized in the later *Dialogues of Saint Gregory*, but these are sketches to illustrate miraculous elements of his career.

Benedict was born into a distinguished family in central Italy, studied at Rome, and early in life was drawn to monasticism. At first he became a hermit, leaving a depressing world—pagan armies on the march, the Church torn by schism, people suffering from war, morality at a low ebb.

He soon realized that he could not live a hidden life in a small town any better than in a large city, so he withdrew to a cave high in the mountains for three years. Some monks chose Benedict as their leader for a while, but found his strictness not to their taste. Still the shift from hermit to community life had begun for him. He had an idea of gathering various families of monks into one "Grand Monastery" to give them the benefit of unity, fraternity, and permanent worship in one house. Finally he began to build what was to become one of the most famous monasteries in the world—Monte Cassino, commanding three narrow valleys running toward the mountains north of Naples.

The Rule that gradually developed prescribed a life of liturgical prayer, study, manual labor, and living together in community under a common abbot. Benedictine asceticism is known for its moderation, and Benedictine charity has always shown concern for the people in the surrounding countryside. In the course of the Middle Ages, all monasticism in the West was gradually brought under the *Rule of St. Benedict*.

Today the Benedictine family is represented by two branches: the Benedictine Federation encompassing the men and women of the Order of St. Benedict; and the Cistercians, men and women of the Order of Cistercians of the Strict Observance.

Reflection

The Church has been blessed through Benedictine devotion to the liturgy, not only in its actual celebration with rich and proper ceremony in the great abbeys, but also through the scholarly studies of many of its members. Liturgy is sometimes confused with guitars or choirs, Latin or Bach. We should be grateful to those who both preserve and adapt the genuine tradition of worship in the Church.
