Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Jesus shares the parable of the Good Samaritan in response to the scholar's question about who his neighbor is. The scholar seems to be trying to limit his responsibility to the law's commands, to draw a boundary around who "counts" as a neighbor and whom he must treat as himself. In response, Jesus describes as an exemplary neighbor this Samaritan who goes out of his way to care for the injured man he stumbles upon. This man is not a neighbor in any of the ways we usually understand; he is a stranger who happens to be on the path, an interruption to the Samaritan's travels, an inconvenience. But the Samaritan responds with extreme care and generosity; he provides first aid and follow-up care, reaching into his own pocket to ensure the robbers' victim is restored to health. Jesus does not answer the scholar's question directly – he does not speak to who is or is not deserving of our neighborly love. He instead describes what it means to *be* a good neighbor, and as with most of Jesus' teachings, it is far more radical than reasonable.

To Experience: Like the scholar, we very often try to figure out the bare minimum that will count as following God's command. We try to limit our belief in Jesus to Sundays and would very much like to proceed with our lives the rest of the week. Jesus reminds us that this is not what he asks – he wants our whole hearts to be his and to be formed in such a way that we respond with spontaneous love to whatever suffering crosses our path.

1. The scholar who questions Jesus is trying to ascertain the bare minimum he can do and still enter eternal life; Jesus calls him rather to a radical change of heart. Where do you struggle to give your whole heart to Jesus? How might he be inviting you to more fully follow him?
2. The Samaritan does not hesitate to offer generous help to the suffering neighbor in his path. How do you respond to the suffering you come across? How might Jesus be inviting you to a more wholehearted response?
3. The Samaritan's response begins with compassion. What does compassion mean to you? How does it lead to action?

Hear to Serve...

INDEPENDENCE DAY?

Just last week we celebrated the 4th of July, this country's Independence Day. We remembered the fight against the British to live free as we see fit from tyranny, to regulate our lives by our rules. Because what did the king of England know about life in America? He was thousands of miles away and couldn't possibly know what's going on here. I'm glad our forefathers won independence for us, but there is one battle that I wish our country would lose and that's the battle that people are fighting for their independence from God.

Why do so many people think that God is our oppressor? We all have busy lives, and if you're raising a family, it's even busier. However, we find time for all kinds of activities if they please us, but when it comes to God, we seem to run out of time. So, we often ignore Him until we need Him for something. Why do we think that God's commands are there to limit us, to enslave us to a life that is incomplete? Our Responsorial Psalm (69) tells us that God doesn't limit us in life, but He gives us a fullness in life we cannot find on our own. **"Turn to the Lord in your need and you will live."**

When we suffer it's very common for people to think one of two things, that God has abandoned us, or we are independent people who can fix all our problems on our own. Psalm 69 reminds us that independence from God does not give us the life we need. "I am afflicted and in pain, let your saving help, O God protect me." How many times in our lives have we suffered, either physical pain or emotional pain? **"Turn to the Lord in your need and you will live."**

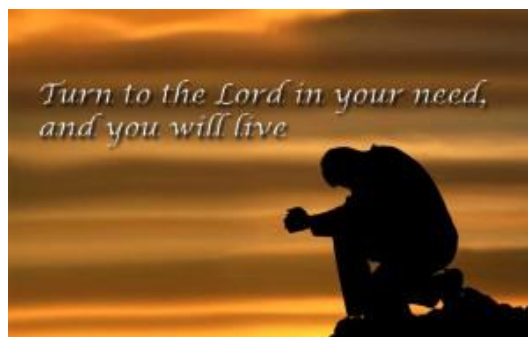
Psalm 69 goes on to say that God is a loving king. We can rely on Him to provide what we need to flourish. "See you lowly ones and be glad, you who seek God, may your hearts revive. For the Lord hears the poor, and His own who are in bonds He spurns not." **"Turn to the Lord in your need and you will live."**

"For God will save Zion, and rebuild the cities of Judah, the descendants of His servants will inherit it and those who love His name shall inhabit it. The Psalmist is telling us that God will rebuild us, and even our descendants will be able to share in God's goodness. **"Turn to the Lord in your need and you will live."**

Let us not forget we were created by God out of His love for us and not His need for us. God created us to know Him, to Love Him, and to serve Him, so we will be eternally happy with Him in the next world, and not to be independent of Him.

In celebration of our dependence, we pray, "I pray to you O Lord, for the time of your favor, O God! In Your kindness answer me with Your constant help. Answer me O Lord, for bounteous is your kindness, in your great mercy turn towards me." AMEN

HT Safety Update

In June 2024, the Pastoral Council of Holy Trinity asked the Manitowoc County Sheriff Department to conduct a security survey of the parish property in response to concerns voiced by parishioners.

A Safety Ad-hoc committee was formed to review the report, make recommendations to the Pastoral Council, and develop a safety plan as requested by the Green Bay Diocese.

From this work, the following safety measures have been implemented:

1. Emergency information has been posted at "landline" phones in the parish hall and kitchen.
2. All church entries have been identified with a number, starting with the main entrance as #1 and proceeding counterclockwise. This will aid in directing emergency responders as well as deliveries.
3. Evacuation routes have been updated and posted in the sacristies, classrooms, conference room, choir and kitchen. The route for the Nave is located on the information board in the main entrance.
4. Severe weather shelters are identified: bathrooms and furnace room.
5. Important contact numbers (HVAC, plumbing, utilities, janitor, B&G members and parish office) are posted in the kitchen, furnace room and janitor's closet.
6. A process has been approved for the allocation and documentation of parish property keys.
7. A new entry lock set, which utilizes security keys, will be installed at the main entrance.
8. A Safety Coordinator position has been approved, reporting to the pastor and the Pastoral Council.

Please take time to review the new postings within the church. Additional information will be presented at the annual meeting in October.
