SG Guardian Angel Statue



The Guardian Angel Statue has stood in front of the Parish Center for all to see for a few decades. Prior to her current home, she stood for a while overlooking the cemetery and also in the current church parking lot (had been in the space between the Sister's home and the old school). Very little history has been located about the statue but the 1910 date on the base tells us there must be stories. (If you know any of the history, please share.)

Through the years and all kinds of weather, the effects are showing. She needs some TLC. There are cracks in the statue, chips on the base, paint that has peeled, etc.

A cost of \$2,000 will cover her repairs. A few donations have already been received to help defray the cost to the parish. A balance of \$1200 remains.

Thoughts for Today's Readings



To the Point: The Mary and Martha story can be frustrating for many of us who like to serve others by doing. Of *course* Martha is worried about many things – she is trying to be a good

host, to provide for the needs of her guests, and she is doing it without the help that she may have been counting on. Jesus reminds us, though, that he calls us not to accomplishment but to relationship. Encounter with him is the basis of true faith, and time spent with him in prayer can strengthen us for service. When we put prayer first, we may find ourselves able to serve as Martha does, but without the anxiety and worry that hold her back from the joy Christ offers.

To Experience: The way we use the word *hospitality* is often a little skewed. We often mean lavish preparations of sparkling clean homes and an overabundance of food. Hosting in this sense is often an exhausting endeavor. Real hospitality might include such preparations, but it more properly means opening not just our homes but our hearts to guests, both human and divine. It means welcoming others in such a way that we are able to be transformed by the encounter.

1. Do you identify more with Martha or with Mary? How do Jesus' words to Martha make you feel? How are they reassuring? How are they an invitation to growth?
2. How do you practice hospitality? Do you see it as an opportunity to show off what you have or as an opportunity to encounter others in mutual vulnerability?
3. What worries and anxieties prevent you from spending more time in the transformative relationship to which Jesus invites you?

Mary Chose the Better Part

In this Sunday Gospel, Jesus enters the home of two sisters – Martha and Mary. While Martha busies herself with the tasks of hospitality, Mary chooses to sit at the feet of Jesus, listening attentively to His words. When Martha complains that her sister isn't helping, Jesus responds with tenderness.

In the culture of the time, it was unusual – and bold – for a woman like Mary to sit as a disciple at the feet of a rabbi. Her posture signals deep desire for discipleship and an eagerness to receive divine wisdom.

The Greek word used for Martha's service (*diakonia*) suggests active ministry or practical service – something vital in the Christian life. But Jesus points out that even good things when disconnected from inner peace and communion with God, can lead to anxiety and distraction.

The "better part" that Mary chooses refers not doing nothing, but to doing the most important thing first – anchoring life in God's word.

In our fast-paced world, we often resemble Martha – busy, distracted, and worried. Like her, we care deeply and want to serve, but we can forget to stay grounded in God's presence.

Mary reminds us that before any work, ministry, or responsibility, we need to spend time with Jesus. Prayer, Scripture, Eucharistic adoration, and silence are not luxuries – they are necessities for a healthy spiritual life.

A well-ordered Christian life doesn't reject service – it integrates it with listening. When we begin our day with the Lord, our service becomes more joyful and less stressful, flowing from love rather than pressure.

This Gospel is not about choosing between Martha and Mary, but about choosing Jesus first – so that, like Mary, we can carry peace into the Marthas of our daily life.

Have I made space in my day to truly listen to Jesus? Can I bring His peace into my busy world this week?

HT Safety Update

In June 2024, the Pastoral Council of Holy Trinity asked the Manitowoc County Sheriff Department to conduct a security survey of the parish property in response to concerns voiced by parishioners.

A Safety Ad-hoc committee was formed to review the report, make recommendations to the Pastoral Council, and develop a safety plan as requested by the Green Bay Diocese.

From this work, the following safety measures have been implemented:

1. Emergency information has been posted at "landline" phones in the parish hall and kitchen.
2. All church entries have been identified with a number, starting with the main entrance as #1 and proceeding counterclockwise. This will aid in directing emergency responders as well as deliveries.
3. Evacuation routes have been updated and posted in the sacristies, classrooms, conference room, choir and kitchen. The route for the Nave is located on the information board in the main entrance.
4. Severe weather shelters are identified: bathrooms and furnace room.
5. Important contact numbers (HVAC, plumbing, utilities, janitor, B&G members and parish office) are posted in the kitchen, furnace room and janitor's closet.
6. A process has been approved for the allocation and documentation of parish property keys.
7. A new entry lock set, which utilizes security keys, will be installed at the main entrance.
8. A Safety Coordinator position has been approved, reporting to the pastor and the Pastoral Council.

Please take time to review the new postings within the church. Additional information will be presented at the annual meeting in October.

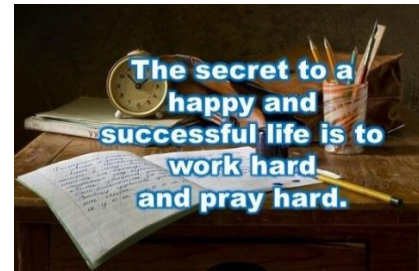
