SG Guardian Angel Statue



The Guardian Angel Statue has stood in front of the Parish Center for all to see for a few decades. Prior to her current home, she stood for a while overlooking the cemetery and also in the current church parking lot (had been in the space between the Sister's home and the old school). Very little history has been located about the statue but the 1910 date on the base tells us there must be stories. (If you know any of the history, please share.)

Through the years and all kinds of weather, the effects are showing. She needs some TLC. There are cracks in the statue, chips on the base, paint that

has peeled, etc.

A cost of \$2,000 will cover her repairs. A few donations have already been received to help defray the cost to the parish. A balance of \$1200 remains.

Thoughts for Today's Readings



To the Point: In this gospel passage, Jesus teaches his disciples the Lord's Prayer, by which we join him in prayer often. By sharing this prayer with us, he empowers us to call God

our Father and shares with us his own sonship. We, as brothers and sisters of Jesus, can join in calling God by this intimate familial title. Jesus also adds a lengthy meditation on what it means to be a father: it means providing for needs in kindness and love. He acknowledges that we humans are imperfect – there are many less-than-loving fathers among us. But we still know something about how fathers ought to be, and God our Father exceeds all this in his generosity.

To Experience: We do not always receive immediate and obvious answers to our prayers, so it can be hard to believe Jesus' words that those who ask will receive and those who seek will find. God moves in ways far more mysterious than these words imply. But we are invited to maintain childlike faith in God our Father even when we do not understand God's ways. He promises us generosity and always wills our good.

1. Jesus teaches us to call God our Father, but fatherhood is far from the only human image that teaches us about God. What images for God speak most to you at this point in your faith journey?
2. What prayers have gone unanswered in your life? How do you maintain trust in God when God's work seems mysterious or distant?

"How Much More Will the Father Give"

Dear Friends in Christ,

In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus teaches His disciples how to pray. After giving them the words of the Lord's Prayer, He tells a short parable about a man who keeps knocking at his friend's door at midnight. Even though the friend is reluctant, he eventually gets up and gives what is needed – because of the man's persistence.

Jesus uses this image to make a striking comparison: "If you, who are flawed, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him?"

Here, Jesus is inviting us to desire more than just daily needs. He is teaching us to ask for the greatest gift of all – the Holy Spirit (The Spirit is God's Best Gift).

When Jesus says the Father will give the Holy Spirit to those who ask, He is saying something profound: God desires to give us not just blessings, but His very self. The Holy Spirit is God's own life and power dwelling within us.

When we receive the Spirit, we receive: Wisdom to make right decisions, Courage to face trials, Comfort in Suffering, Joy in our faith, and strength to love when love is hard.

Prayer is about Relationship. The Gospel begins with the disciples asking, "Lord, teach us to pray." And Jesus begins: "Our Father..."

This reminds us that prayer isn't a transaction. It's a conversation with our loving Father. He knows what we need, but He wants us to come to Him freely, like children – trusting, persistent, and open.

And unlike the friend who reluctantly gives in, God is never annoyed or tired of our asking. He is ready to fill us with the Spirit when we come to Him in faith.

This week, take a few moments each day to say a simple prayer: "Come, Holy Spirit. Teach me. Strengthen me. Guide me."

We don't need long words or perfect feelings. Just come with a sincere heart. God will do the rest. He is the "how much more" God – always ready to pour out His grace.

Let us not settle for small favors when the Lord offers us His Spirit, who transforms everything.
