Thoughts for Today's Readings



To the Point: Jesus' words in this gospel may sound harsh – he does not want any of us to assume inclusion in his kingdom and does want us to stay on guard against sin's snares. We need to stay attentive to listening to him and

following him, not resting in a status quo. But his overall message here is not one of exclusion; the point is actually radical inclusion. God's kingdom will embrace people from all places and our typical human boundaries will not apply. We cannot rest in human ideas of who is in or out; we can rest in the radically inclusive love of God.

To Experience: Because our human minds are limited, it is only natural for humans to divide ourselves into more manageable groups – and we're very good at it, drawing boundaries on boundaries. We divide ourselves by class, race, religion, sexual orientation, political opinion, vocation, and on and on. We love to feel that we are "in" and often achieve that feeling by keeping others out. This is not how God works – God is big enough for all of this. God's love does not divide or exclude. It is so much bigger than we can comprehend, able to offer abundant life across all these divisions.

1. How could you shake up the status quo in your life and more radically include someone different from you?
2. Whom do you struggle to see as included in God's kingdom? How might God be inviting you to reach out to that particular person or group?

Hear to Serve.....

BE LIKE CHILDREN?

In Matthew's Gospel the Disciples asked Jesus, "Who will be the greatest in the Kingdom of Heaven?" Jesus called a child over to Himself and told them if they did not become like a child, they wouldn't even enter the kingdom of Heaven (Mt 18:1-4). What did Jesus mean by this? Jesus was talking about humility; we must be humble before God. Jesus did not mean that our knowledge of our faith and our relationship with God should remain immature. So many people think that the day they receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, their learning about God and the Faith are over with. There is often the sense of, "I have graduated." I hate to be the bearer of bad news, but if that's your thought process, you are doing damage to your spiritual life and to your soul.

The good news is that our two parishes are providing many opportunities for all of us to deepen our knowledge of God and our faith. The first event this fall is the Fourth Annual Day of Prayer and Retreat on October 18. The featured speaker this year is Sister Marie Kolbe Zamora from Holy Family Convent in Manitowoc. Sister Marie Kolbe is a member of the Franciscan Sisters of Christian Charity. She holds an S.T.B., S.T.L. in Dogmatic Theology, and S.T.D. from the Pontifical Gregorian University, specializing in Bonaventure and Ecclesiology. Formerly the Chair of the Department of Theology and Ministry at Silver Lake College of the Holy Family, she has just concluded serving as a theologian on the staff of the General Secretariat of the Synod in Rome. Sister has also been asked to address the Education Department Heads of the U.K. in London in October. Are you feeling intimidated? Well, you should not be. Sister Marie Kolbe will be presenting a message for the heart of our parishes. This is an event that you really do not want to miss!

Our Adult Formation Speaker Series will begin on Wednesday, November 19 with Deacon Dave Scheuer. Deacon Dave is from the Denmark area, and he speaks about his real-life experiences in the presence of the Eucharist at Mass and outside of Mass in Adoration. This is a powerful presentation, so put it on your calendar.

We also have another Women's Study beginning in September. The topic will be St. Therese of Lisieux. This is a chance to learn more about the God-given dignity of women through the life of a great saint and Doctor of the Church.

Don't forget about the Bible Study Group held at Holy Trinity every Tuesday. Studying Holy Scripture with others really helps to deepen our understanding. It builds community and gives us the confidence to share the Word of God with others.

Let's have a humble and childlike spirit before God. However, we should not be childish in our understanding of faith and our relationship with God. There are so many opportunities for us to become more mature Catholics. Our goal is not to claim the highest position in Heaven—God already holds that honor—but rather to enter Heaven and behold the Face of God.

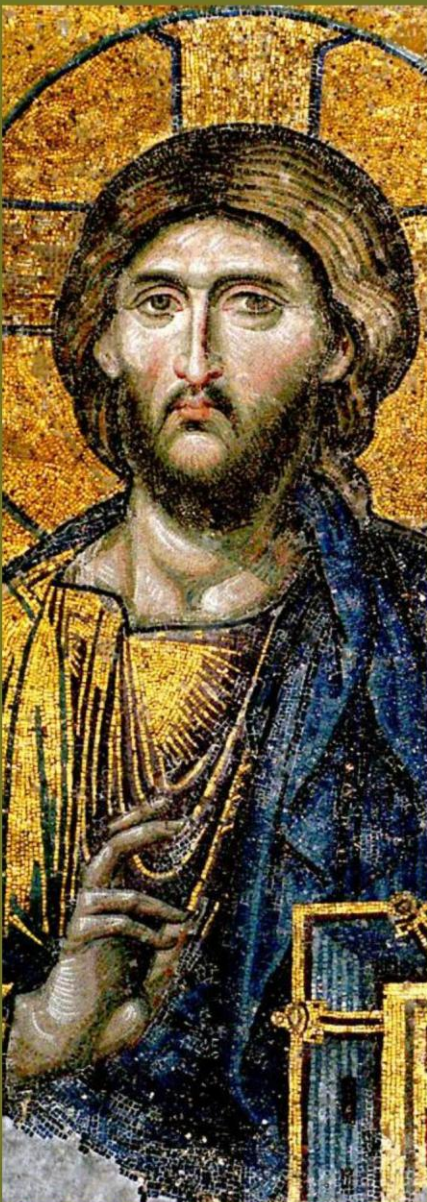
