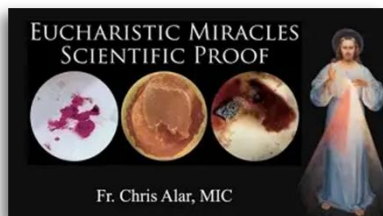

Thoughts for Today's Readings



To the Point: In this gospel, Jesus calls us to be trustworthy but in a rather roundabout parable that makes a dishonest steward a model of prudence. This steward is careful to

provide for himself, cleverly arranging to be received favorably when he is out of work. Jesus wants us to similarly prepare our spiritual accounts so that we might be ready to take on the true wealth of heaven. In so doing, we need to detach from the things of this life in order to follow God. Jesus always asks us for wholehearted devotion. He wants nothing less from us than our whole hearts and our whole lives and our whole selves. This can seem demanding, but it is also for our own good. Being whole is healthier than being divided.

To Experience: "The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones" gives us a pretty good working definition of virtue. When we practice virtue, we get better at it. Like our physical muscles, these spiritual muscles strengthen with use, making it easier to make the right choice the next time. Practicing virtue is made up of many small choices, choices that might seem insignificant on their own. But by making the virtuous choice over and over again, even when no one can see and it might not matter, we become more able to make the right choice in more difficult circumstances, too.

1. What in your life threatens to be "mammon," a false object of devotion? What things do you spend time, attention, and money on? Do they align with your true values?
2. What small choices do you make regularly that add up to greater virtue?
3. What is an area in which you need to grow? What small steps could you commit to in order to begin this growth?

*"You cannot serve both God and wealth."
(Luke 16:13)*

This Sunday's Gospel gives us one of the most surprising parables of Jesus – the story of the steward who was about to lose his job. Instead of condemning the steward's attitude, Jesus praises him for his prudence. At first glance, this may confuse us. Why would Jesus highlight someone who had mismanaged his master's property? The answer is simple: Jesus is not praising dishonesty, but rather the ability to use resources with purpose.

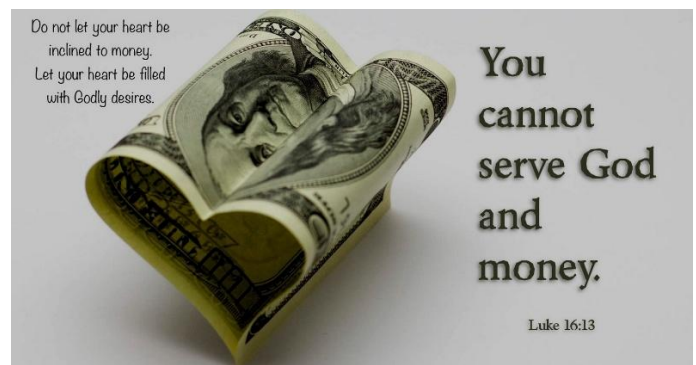
The steward acted with urgency. He knew he had little time, so he used the opportunity to prepare for the future. Jesus points out that the "Children of this world" sometimes act more decisively than the "children of light." In other words, if people can be shrewd in managing worldly affairs, shouldn't we be even more committed when it comes to eternal life?

Here we are invited to see the heart of the message. Wealth, no matter how it comes, is not meant to be stored or worshiped. It is meant to serve others. Money is dangerous when it becomes our master; it blinds us to God's light. But when wealth is shared, it becomes a channel of blessing: lifting up the poor, feeding the hungry, and bringing dignity to those in need. That is why Jesus insists "You cannot serve both God and wealth." If we start clinging to money, it will consume us, and we will no longer live as children of the light.

Who, then, are the children of the light? They are those who do not live for themselves, but for others. They see their talents, time, and treasures as gifts to be poured out for the good of their neighbor. They are people who give life with what they have, just as Christ gave His very life for us.

This Gospel is not only about money – it is about where our hearts are. Do we live only for ourselves, or do we live for God and for others? Every choice we make with our resources- whether big or small – reveals whom we are truly serving.

SG one by One Campaign Funds Recommendation

SG Finance Council has made a recommendation to redirect the balance of funds from the one by One Campaign (after the cost of the narthex) toward building and maintenance needs of the parish.
