In the Gospel, Jesus ends with words that challenge our modern way of thinking: "We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we are obliged to do." At first, it may sound discouraging – why should we see ourselves as "unprofitable" after working so hard? Yet Jesus is teaching us something essential about the heart of discipleship: everything we have, everything we are, is a gift from God.

When a servant completes his responsibility, he has not performed something extraordinary – he has simply fulfilled his role. In the same way, when we pray, forgive, show kindness, or serve in the parish, we are not doing God a "favor." We are living out the very purpose for which we were created: to love God and to love one another.

This attitude frees us from pride and entitlement. Too often, our culture and society tell us to expect recognition, applause, or rewards for everything we do. But the Gospel invites us to a deeper humility: to serve with love, without seeking credit, knowing that God Himself sees the hidden sacrifices of our hearts. True greatness in God's eyes comes not from being celebrated but from being faithful.

This does not mean that our efforts are meaningless. On the contrary, when we serve humbly, we imitate Christ Himself, "who came not to be served but to serve" (Mark 10:45). It means that our faith is genuine when we stop measuring our good deeds by human standards of success and instead see them as our natural response to God's overwhelming grace.

So let us take Jesus' words not as a rebuke, but as an invitation: to live our Christian lives with gratitude and humility, always remembering that God's love is far greater than anything we could "earn." At the end of the day, we are servants – yet beloved ones, called to do our duty joyfully, knowing that our reward is not earthly applause but eternal communion with Him.

"We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we are obliged to do." May this truth keep us humble, faithful, and grateful in our daily walk with Christ.

Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Jesus here speaks of the power of faith. He promises that even a small amount of faith gives a great amount of power. The example he gives is absurd – trees do not obey commands to uproot themselves and grow in the sea. The hard implication here is that, since we are not able to move trees around on command, our faith is really rather small. And he's right – in comparison to the vastness of God's love and goodness, anything we are offering is always too small. Our faith, our gratitude, our praise can never be enough to repay the debt we owe to God.

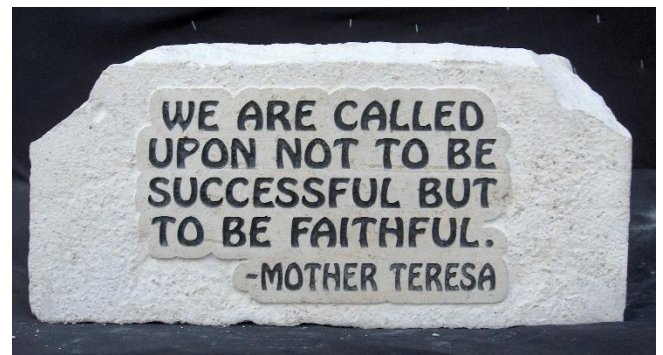
To Experience: Many of us have had a crisis of faith, often brought about by some unanswered prayer that makes us doubt God's goodness or God's power or God's very presence. Habakkuk reminds us that the answers to our prayers do not always come on the timeline we wish they would. God's kingdom is unfolding slowly, and we are part of a much bigger story than our own.

1. How is your faith these days? Are you content with it? How do you wish it could change or grow?
2. How do you respond to unanswered prayers? What helps you remember to be patient with God's timeline rather than imposing your own?
3. The psalm reminds us to "harden not [our] hearts" to God's voice. How do you keep your heart receptive to the word of God?

Who is St. Gianna?

In less than 40 years, Gianna Beretta Molla became a pediatric physician, a wife, a mother and a saint!

She was born in Magenta near Milano, the tenth of Alberto and Maria Beretta's 13 children. An active member of the St. Vincent de Paul Society and a leader in the Catholic Action movement, Saint Gianna Beretta Molla also enjoyed skiing and mountain climbing. She earned degrees in medicine and surgery from the University of Pavia, eventually specializing in pediatrics. In 1952, Gianna opened a clinic in the small town of Mesero, where she met engineer Pietro Molla.



Shortly before their 1955 marriage, Gianna wrote to Pietro: "Love is the most beautiful sentiment that the Lord has put into the soul of men and women." In the next four years the Mollas had three children: Pierluigi, Mariolina, and Laura. Two pregnancies following ended in miscarriage.

Early in her final pregnancy, doctors discovered that Gianna had both a child and a tumor in her uterus. She allowed the surgeons to remove the tumor but not to perform the complete hysterectomy that they recommended, which would have killed the child. Seven months later in April 1962, Gianna Emanuela Molla was born at the hospital in Monza, but post-operative complications resulted in an infection for her mother. The following week Gianna Molla died at home, and was buried in the cemetery of Mesero.

Gianna Emanuela went on to become a physician herself. Saint Gianna Beretta Molla was beatified in 1994 and canonized 10 years later. Her liturgical feast is celebrated on April 28.
