Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: As we reach the halfway point of Advent, the readings for today seem less focused on preparation and more on enduring

the wait. God is coming, but not quite yet. John the Baptist, seen last week as a fiery preacher, seems particularly impatient – is Jesus the expected messiah or is he not? This week is an invitation to re-engage with Advent, regardless how we've done thus far. We still have (almost) two weeks of Advent left, even if our minds are already on Christmas. On the other hand, we also are reassured that God will arrive in time, even if God seems far off at the moment. The season of Advent holds both of these truths together – the fullness of God's kingdom is coming, but it's also not quite here yet. For now, we wait, but God will be here soon enough.

To Experience: Radio stations and streaming services have been pushing Christmas music for weeks now, and maybe you've already finished your preparations for the Christmas season. In this case, the Scriptures' call to slow down and be patient might be a helpful reminder to appreciate this time of Advent. Alternatively, maybe you feel especially in need of God's loving presence in a difficult winter season. In this space, God might be trying to remind you of his persistent love for you in a time of waiting and endurance. In either case, God desires to draw near to us as we wait in expectation.

1. As we mark the halfway point of Advent, where has God been present with you in the previous two weeks? How might Jesus be inviting you to draw closer to God's love in the remaining time in this season?

A Message of Joy Amid Expectation

Welcome to Gaudete Sunday! The third Sunday of Advent is the Gaudete Sunday. The rose candle signifies a shift in our journey. It invites us to rejoice as Christmas is coming near. The readings we have this weekend, especially from Isaiah and James, remind us that the Lord is near and His salvation is coming.

In the Gospel, John the Baptist is in prison and is facing execution. He sends his disciples to ask Jesus, "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?".

John's question here might seem to imply a crisis of faith. Why would the prophet who leapt in his mother's womb at the sight of Mary, the one who baptized Jesus in the Jordan, suddenly doubt?

The tradition interprets John's inquiry not as personal doubt, but as a final, pastoral act of love and guidance for his own followers:

- Guiding the Disciples: John knew his time was short. He wanted his disciples to see Jesus' messianic actions firsthand. By hearing Jesus speak and witnessing His miracles, they would receive the clear evidence needed to confidently follow Christ after John's death. He was sending them to the source of truth.
- 2. Clarifying the Kingdom: John expected a fiery, apocalyptic Messiah—one who would "clear his threshing floor" with judgment. Jesus' ministry, however, was characterized by quiet compassion, healing, and teaching the poor. John may have been seeking reassurance that these works, though gentle, were indeed the fulfillment of the prophecies. He was asking God to clarify how the Kingdom was arriving, not if it was arriving.

Our Call to Joy and Witness

Jesus' response to John's question is a profound sign for us today: "Go and tell John what you hear and see." Jesus points not to a title, but to His actions. He is making God's presence known through acts of mercy, love, and restoration.

This Gaudete Sunday, we are called to bring our own questions, our anxieties, and our expectations for a perfect Christmas season to the Lord. We are asked to see Christ at work, not just in grand miracles, but in the quiet acts of charity, forgiveness, and hope that surround us.

We are called to be the answer to the world's questions. By living the Gospel, we make Christ's presence visible, just as He did.

Let us rejoice, for the Lord is truly near. Let us be strong and fear not, for our God will come.

- Together with incense, vespers is a powerful way to pray, and thank God for the day. (Psalm 141:2) "Let my prayer be counted as incense before thee, and the lifting up of my hands as an evening sacrifice!"

We will be praying Vespers to prepare ourselves during the season of Advent, for the coming Christmas season.

Prayers of Preparation for the Coming of Christmas

These "O" antiphons express the theology of Advent and are the season's brightest jewels. The incarnation of the Son, salvation, the pursuit of our redemption until the end of time — these are the constant themes of Advent theology. From them we can see that the celebration of Advent, like that of Christmas, has its true center in the paschal mystery, wherein the death and resurrection of Christ accomplishes our salvation.

December 17 - 1st Antiphon: O WISDOM

O WISDOM, O holy Word of God, you govern all creation with Your strong yet tender care. Come and show Your people the way to salvation.

Prayer: Christ, the Word of the Father, through all the ages You have cared for Your people as a shepherd his flock, as a mother her child, as a potter his clay. Be present to us who cry out for Your compassionate, helping hand. Help us to be faithful to those values which You taught us by Your life and Your love. May we find Your presence in the needs of the poor and abandoned around us. Amen.

December 18 - 2nd Antiphon: O Adonai

O LORD OF ISRAEL, who showed Yourself to Moses in the burning bush, who gave him the holy law on Sinai mountain: Come, stretch out Your mighty hand, to set us free.

Prayer: Lord, our God, reveal Yourself to us in the persons, circumstances, and events of each day, especially in those who need our time and talents. Open our eyes to recognize Your workings in all that happens to us; keep us open to Your coming to us in the unusual events and surprises of each day. May the place of our work become "holy ground" for we believe that You are present everywhere. Amen.

December 19 - 3rd Antiphon: O FLOWER OF JESSE

O FLOWER OF JESSE, You have been raised up as a sign for all peoples; kings stand silent in Your presence; the nations bow down in worship before You. Come, let nothing keep You from coming to our aid.

Prayer: O Christ, living sign of the Father's love, we adore You as the Center of our lives. You are our model for grace, truth, and living in the light of the Father. Be our strength in times of sorrow and trouble; be our joy in times of sadness; be our light in the darkness of sin and our troubled world. We are in awe of Your holy Presence. May we rejoice and share the signs of Your coming with one another. Amen.

December 20 - 4th Antiphon: O KEY OF DAVID

O KEY OF DAVID, O royal Power of Israel controlling at Your will the gate of heaven: Come, break down the prison walls of death for those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death & lead Your captive people into freedom.

Prayer: Christ Jesus, You are the key to the happiness of our hearts. The darkness of sin and the awareness of our weaknesses drag us down, but You have come to lift us up & redeem us. We place all our hope in You who have freed us from sin. Teach us to open the doors of our hearts to You and to one another through awareness of the mystery of Your Presence in others. Lead us into the light of Your love & grace. Amen.



December 21 - 5th Antiphon: O DAYSPRING

O RISING DAWN, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: Come, shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.

Prayer: Radiance of the Father, light for our eyes, and guide for our souls, brighten our days by showing us the way to the Father, for You said, "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life." Your life showed us the way to live; Your words spoke of the truth of the Father; Your sufferings and death brought us to new life. May we be radiant with Your joy, as we begin to recognize Your coming to us in one another. We thank You for the gift of Your Body and Blood in the Eucharist which nourishes us and gives us renewed life. Amen.

December 22 - 6th Antiphon: O KING OF ALL NATIONS

O KING OF ALL NATIONS, the only joy of every human heart: O Keystone of the mighty arch of man. Come and save the creatures you fashioned from the dust.

Prayer: Lord, every nation on earth adores You, for by Your passion, death, and resurrection, You have saved all humanity. Your constant love and friendship reach from the heavens to the ends of the earth. You alone have bridged the deep chasm created by sin; You have protected us from the grasp of the evil one. You are the source of all life; help us to be as one family in You, our God and Savior. Amen.

December 23 - 7th Antiphon: O EMMANUEL, GOD-WITH-US

O GOD-WITH-US, Emmanuel, king and lawgiver, desire of the nations, Savior of all people, Come and set us free, Lord our God.

Prayer: Jesus, God-with-us, all compassionate and loving God whom we honor and adore, You have unlocked the gates of heaven and cleared the pathway for all humanity to come to You in the glory of the Father. Save us from the chains of sin and darkness. We thank you for the gift of redemption and look forward to the day of Your coming in glory. Amen.

HT Parish Office Project Following the November council meetings, Fr. Josuva accepted the recommendation from parishioners and council members to move forward with Option 2: Repurpose existing classrooms within the church building. The committee is currently meeting with contractors.

SG Sound Project Work has been happening behind the scenes in preparation for the sound system installation. The sanctuary candle has been moved, outlets for the speakers have been installed in the front pillars, and behind-the-scenes wiring has been put in. Unfortunately, Northern Sound and Video could not begin installation during the first two weeks of December because of another commitment. Based on that information and consideration of the church decorations remaining in place throughout the Christmas season (until Baptism of the Lord on January 11th), the new date to begin the sound system installation is January 14.




