Votives & Vigils Monday, January 5, 6:30-7:30pm at Holy Trinity.

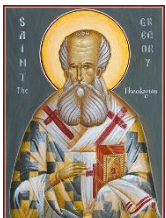

Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Parenthood is a tough task and maybe especially at Mass, where the expectations for behavior are the exact opposite of toddler's usual mode of being. Today's readings are a reminder of the important role that parents play, modeling in their own families God's loving care for his children. Joseph in particular is shown as taking decisive action to look after his family, even in the face of fear. Give thanks to God for the presence of young families at Mass. Perhaps you are a parent yourself and know the struggle of caring for children at Mass. Take the time to pray for all parents of our parish, and these young families especially, that God's word of encouragement might console them as they live their vocation.

To Experience: Family can be one of life's biggest blessings but also one of its greatest challenges. These relationships can support us in times of need, but they are also themselves often the source of frustration and tension. As is often said, we do not choose our families. What we can choose is how we respond. Our attempts to love our family members, even when difficult and no matter how imperfectly, may be a means to grow in holiness.

Our Home, a Place of Grace

Dear Friends,

The Church is inviting us to pause at the threshold of the New Year to look at the "hidden life" of the Holy Family in Nazareth.

We often see Jesus, Mary, and Joseph in the peaceful stillness of our nativity scene. The Feast of the Holy Family reminds us that they were a flesh-and-blood family who knew the same rhythms we do: the hard work of the trade, the shared meals, and the deep anxieties of life.

They faced several difficulties in their life: the displacement as refugees in Egypt and the agonizing search for a child who remained behind in the Temple, and other which are recorded in the Bible. In their struggles, we find our own stories reflected.

The "Domestic Church" in Our Midst

The Holy Family is not a model of "perfection" that is out of our reach; rather, they are a model of **faithfulness**.

Holiness in our homes doesn't mean a life without conflict or messiness. It means, as St. Paul reminds us in today's reading to the Colossians, "putting on" heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, and—above all—forgiveness.

Our families are the first place we learn to love and be loved. Whether your "family" consists of a large household, a small group of close friends, or our own parish community, this is where the "Domestic Church" lives. It is in the simple acts—listening with patience, sharing a meal without the distraction of screens, or offering a word of encouragement—that Christ becomes present at our table.

A Personal Invitation for 2026

As we look toward the New Year, I invite you to make one small, concrete change to strengthen your home as a sanctuary of peace:

- **Pray Together:** Even a simple "Bless us, O Lord" before a meal can center your day on God.
- **Forgive Quickly:** Make your home a "confessional rather than a courtroom," where mistakes are met with mercy rather than judgment.
- **See the "Bigger Picture":** In moments of stress or weakness, remember that God is working through our frailties just as He did through St. Joseph's fears.

Thank you for being part of this faith family. Each of you brings a unique light to our parish, and I am deeply grateful to walk this journey with you. May the Holy Family of Nazareth—Jesus, Mary, and Joseph—bless your hearts and homes with the peace that only Christ can give.

4 Simple Spiritual Resolutions for the New Year

Have you thought about making a spiritual resolution for 2026? It's great to focus on physical health, but what about your spiritual health? What might a spiritual resolution look like? Here are a few examples:



1. Begin your day with the Morning Offering

What is the first thing you do when you wake up in the morning? Hit the snooze button? Roll over? Complain that you need more sleep? St. Josemaría Escrivá wrote about the heroic minute, meaning that once the alarm rings, get up, and say a prayer. There is a traditional prayer you could learn called the Morning Offering. It's a beautiful prayer which helps us give to God everything we will do during the day.

O Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer you my prayers, works, joys, and sufferings of this day for all the intentions of your Sacred Heart, in union with the holy sacrifice of the Mass throughout the world, for the salvation of souls, the reparation of sins, the reunion of all Christians, and in particular for the intentions of the Holy Father this month. Amen.

2. Daily or weekly rosary

Many Catholics learned the rosary as a child. Some pray it every day. Others occasionally. And the rest, rarely. The rosary is a great way for us to reflect on the life of Jesus and Mary, and to pray with the scriptures. If you are new to the rosary, begin with a decade each day, and move your way up. Pray it once a week. Or strive to pray it daily.



3. Read or pray with the Bible

There are different apps and books that could help you read the entire Bible during 2026. Or maybe choose to read a certain section of the Bible and expand your selection once you completed your goal. Read the Gospels, or the letters of St. Paul, or the prophetic writings. Come to a greater knowledge of the word of God. And while you are at it, you can pray with the Bible, through a process called lectio divina, in which one reads a passage and spends a few moments meditating on a word or phrase, engaging with the Scripture passage. Through this prayer, God speaks in a deeper way to our souls about the Scripture contemplated.

4. End your day with an Examen

What if every day you did an Examen? It's not just identifying our faults but also calling to mind how God was with you throughout the day, where you received his grace, and how you could respond to grace better tomorrow. Just as we begin our day offering it to God, it's just as good to end our day asking, "How did I live for God today?"

These are 4 simple spiritual resolutions. It's not expected to do all 4, nor is it recommended taking on all 4 on Jan. 1. Instead, choose one. Do it well. And decide what your next

step is. It's possible you might end up doing all 4, but that can occur throughout the year.
