Thoughts for Today's Readings



To the Point: There are two important proclamations of God's word in today's gospel: one is the message of John the Baptist to his disciples, and the other is the voice of the Father

to his Son. In his baptism, Jesus is acknowledged as the beloved Son of the Father. In our own baptism, we get this same message – that God has chosen us as his sons and daughters. This is what the gospel, the “good news” is all about! We often lose sight of this essential truth and get bogged down in other things – stress, our jobs, our families, and even our desire to follow God. All these things can get in the way of recognizing that we are *beloved*. Spend time in prayer allowing God to love you as son or daughter. Recognizing God's love in your own life, you can more effectively share it with others.

To Experience: The readings today speak quite a bit about God's call, but for many of us it's hard to articulate a clear moment of being called by God. Where is God's will for me? What am I being called to do? In these moments, we can pray together with Thomas Merton, “I believe that the desire to please you does in fact please you.” If we trust this, every day becomes the environment in which God has placed us to love and serve him and his children.

1. Jesus hears the voice of the Father saying, “You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.” Do you believe God loves you in much the same way? Where do you struggle to recognize God's love?

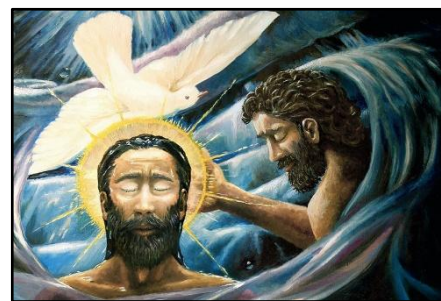

BAPTISM OF THE LORD

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, on the last day of our



Christmas Season, the question often comes up in people's minds; *Why did Jesus have to be baptized?* We all know that Jesus was truly human in every way except for having sin. Jesus was born of a human mother. He had to be taught as a young child. He got sick. He had to eat. But Jesus did not have original sin nor did he ever commit sin. Even John, who was baptizing the people, knew when he saw Jesus coming to be baptized that it was Jesus who should have baptized John and not John who should have been baptizing Jesus. So why would Jesus have to get baptized?

We know when we are baptized that Jesus uses water to cleanse our souls, to wash away original sin. Then the Holy Spirit is given to us to replace Original Sin just like the Holy Spirit came out of the heavens at Jesus' baptism. When Jesus was baptized it was different than our Baptism. When Jesus was baptized by John, the water didn't sanctify Jesus; Jesus sanctified the water so that we could be sanctified by our baptismal waters.

By Jesus changing those waters, our baptism begins the reason why Jesus came to earth, to save us from our sins. With our Original Sin removed by our baptism, the doors to our Eternal Life have become opened for us. That is why we are taught that to be saved we need to be baptized. If the doors are closed and locked, we cannot enter, but baptism unlocks those doors and opens them up and gives us the opportunity to enter His Divine Life.

Most of us were brought to the sacrament by our parents as infants. Some of us are baptized as adults. God also gives the graces of baptism to those who have not been baptized but have died for Christ (Baptism by Fire). He also grants baptism to those who were intending baptism but died before receiving it. God's mercy knows no bounds.

While the Sacrament of Baptism truly changes our spiritual nature and makes us adopted sons and daughters of God, there is no magic show here. As we all know too well, through our own experience, or seeing the actions of others, we have the ability to pull that door to the Divine Life again. We have the free-will to cooperate with the graces given to us in baptism or to ignore them.

What a gift we are given by the Father through His Son. Jesus, who sanctifies the waters of Baptism gives us the Holy Spirit, the love and life of God Himself. Let us rejoice and recommit our hearts and our lives to the baptismal promises to truly live as sons and daughters of God.

In compliance with what is established by n. 11b of the *Norms to be observed in Inquiries made by Bishops in the Causes of Saints*, promulgated on February 7, 1983, by the Dicastery of the Causes of Saints, with the current Edict I make public the *Supplex libellus* of the Postulator and exhort all the faithful to provide me with useful information about the Cause.

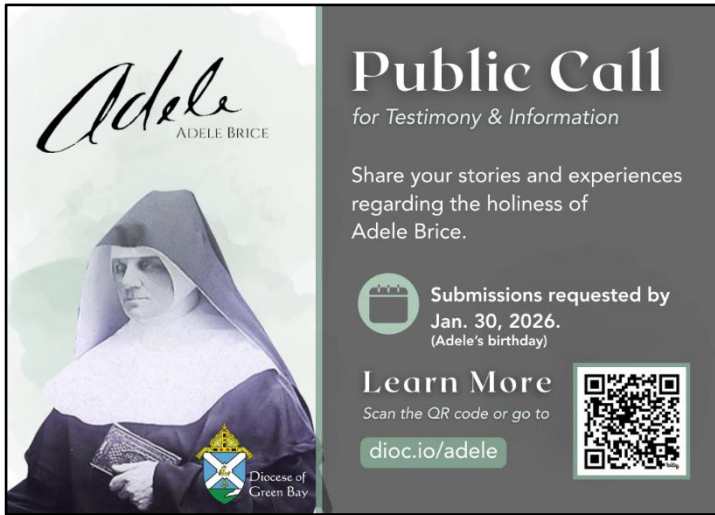

Who Is Adele Brice?

Adele Brice was born in Belgium in 1831. When she was 24, her parents made the decision to immigrate to America and settle in the new state of Wisconsin. Although hesitant, Adele was obedient to her parents, trusting that the Lord had a plan for her in the new world. In the fall of 1859, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to Adele three times while she was walking through the woods. During the third apparition, The Blessed Virgin spoke to Adele and instructed her to "Offer her Communion for the conversion of sinners," and to "Gather the children in this wild country and teach them what they should know for salvation."

This message was the catalyst for the many years of Adele's service to the people of the Northeast Wisconsin area. In humble obedience to Our Lady, Adele traveled within a 50-mile radius of her home, evangelizing and teaching children about God and preparing them for their first Holy Communion.

Through profound trust in Mary's intercession, Adele bore heroic witness to miraculous events, including the preservation of the wooden Apparition Chapel that was in the direct path of the Great Peshtigo Fire of 1871, and the many graces received to assist in her mission.

Eventually, Adele founded a school with some local companions on the grounds where Mary appeared to her. There, they would care for the children and teach them the Catholic faith until she passed away in 1896. Her headstone reads, "Sacred Cross under thy shadow I rest and hope".
