Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: "Oh yeah, I know this passage well!" Perhaps this is your reaction when seeing a recognizable selection in the upcoming Sunday's readings. On one hand, this is great! We should strive for a familiarity with Scripture. But on the other, we risk missing the ever-newness of God's word if we rely too firmly on what we have already learned. In the first reading, the servant in Isaiah is called beyond Israel – God's chosen people – because God desires that the whole human race be consecrated to him. In today's selection from the Gospel of John, John the Baptist tells the crowds who are gathered to see him that there is someone else they should be following instead: "Behold, the Lamb of God." God has more in store even than John the Baptist – Jesus, God himself. In practice, we might think we understand a Scripture passage well, but there is always something new that God can reveal to us each time we approach a Scripture passage.

To Experience: Knowing what God desires from us and having the courage to follow are two separate things. Even when we recognize God's will for us, we can find ourselves lacking in the ability to respond accordingly, or even in the desire to do so. St. Ignatius reminds us that when we lack the desire to follow God, we can pray to "desire the desire." God is able to work with whatever we offer to him, and the more we continue to offer ourselves to God, the more that God can transform us into the people he has called us to be.

Hear to Serve...

Prepare for Mission

In today's first reading, Isaiah introduces us to God's chosen servant, a light to all nations who brings salvation to all people. This message is also a reminder that each of us is given a divine mission—to share God's love and light in the world using our own unique gifts and talents.

The Psalm we sing at Mass, "Here I am, Lord, I come to do your will" is our response to our call from God. By saying "yes" to God's call, we agree to cooperate with His divine will and purpose. This response is not only an obligation, but it is a commitment to live according to His guidance and grace that comes from our hearts.

In the second reading from 1 Corinthians, St. Paul speaks to the community, reminding them of their sanctified identity in Christ Jesus. He emphasizes the importance of unity and the unique role each member plays in building up the Church. We, too, are called to remember that we are children of God, contributing our distinctive gifts in love and service. This unity strengthens us and helps us to reflect the light of Christ.

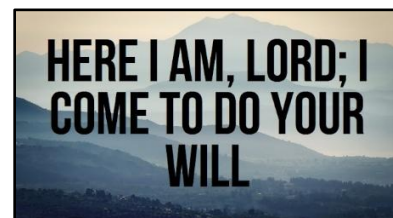
In the Gospel, John the Baptist identifies Jesus as the Lamb of God, the fulfillment of God's promise to redeem humanity. John shows humility and obedience by directing others to Christ rather than seeking personal glory. His actions inspire us to respond to Jesus as the servants in Isaiah and as the Corinthians did—by accepting our vocation and actively living out our faith.

There are three questions we need to ask ourselves, "How do I respond to God's call?", "Am I willing to be a witness to the love of Christ?" and "Am I prepared to declare that Jesus is my light, the light that brings salvation?"

Living out the faith is not always easy. We may not be sure of what we should do at a given moment. Sometimes we lack the confidence that we are worthy to be His disciple. This is when we look back to St. Paul's message and realize that we are part of a community; we are not alone. That is why our parishes are part of a special initiative in the Diocese. We have an opportunity this Lent to come together in small groups. In seven meetings, we will watch the video series *The Search*. We will have time to discuss, ask questions, talk together, and to grow in faith. This is a completely free program. Check the back of church for more information and registration.

We have heard our call to mission, to be a disciple of Christ. Let's answer, "Here I am, Lord" from our hearts. Then let us prepare ourselves well so that we can be like John and say, "Now I have seen and have testified that he is the Son of God."

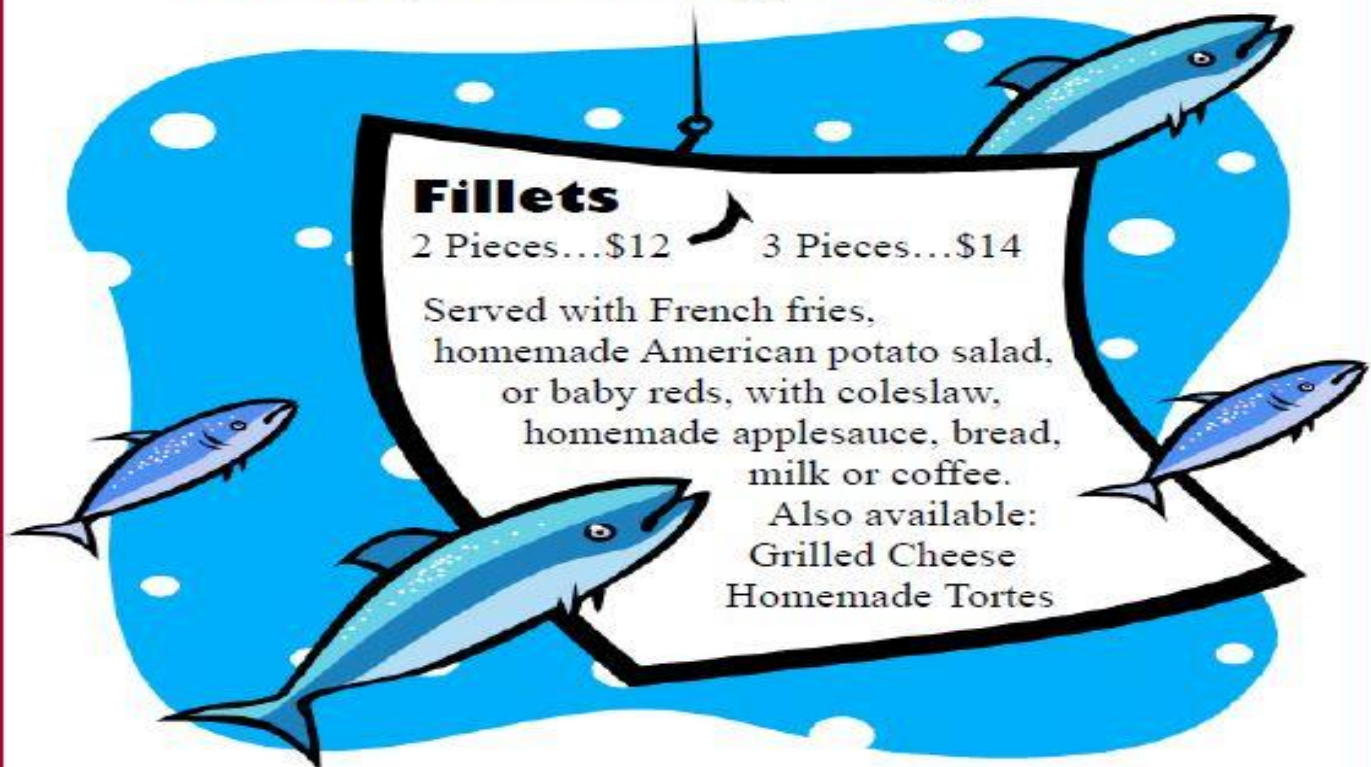

Who Is Adele Brice?

Adele Brice was born in Belgium in 1831. When she was 24, her parents made the decision to immigrate to America and settle in the new state of Wisconsin. Although hesitant, Adele was obedient to her parents, trusting that the Lord had a plan for her in the new world. In the fall of 1859, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to Adele three times while she was walking through the woods. During the third apparition, The Blessed Virgin spoke to Adele and instructed her to "Offer her Communion for the conversion of sinners," and to "Gather the children in this wild country and teach them what they should know for salvation."

This message was the catalyst for the many years of Adele's service to the people of the Northeast Wisconsin area. In humble obedience to Our Lady, Adele traveled within a 50-mile radius of her home, evangelizing and teaching children about God and preparing them for their first Holy Communion.

Through profound trust in Mary's intercession, Adele bore heroic witness to miraculous events, including the preservation of the wooden Apparition Chapel that was in the direct path of the Great Peshtigo Fire of 1871, and the many graces received to assist in her mission.

Eventually, Adele founded a school with some local companions on the grounds where Mary appeared to her. There, they would care for the children and teach them the Catholic faith until she passed away in 1896. Her headstone reads, "Sacred Cross under thy shadow I rest and hope".
