Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Jesus has a lot to say in today's gospel, which is taken from the Sermon on the Mount for the third consecutive week. Importantly, he begins with the context in which his audience lives: "You have heard that it was said." Using the passive voice, Jesus acknowledges where the crowd has come to understand God's work in their lives, first of all through the Law of Moses and its interpretation. Through the Law, God desired to gather a people for himself and to show them his love and care for them. Jesus acknowledges the importance of the Law here – in fact, it remains a guide, and one more thing that Jesus will bring to fulfillment. Jesus does not abrogate the Law, but in fact extends it further. Not murder alone, but anger as well; not just adultery, but lust also. Acknowledging their understanding and current practice, Jesus invites his audience to recognize God in a newer, more personal way – in himself – and challenges them to look beyond the written Law to its divine Author, present in their midst.

To Experience: For many, particular teachings of the church can be a sticking point, a source of genuine anguish and frustration. Sometimes, God's wisdom seems to stand mysteriously beyond our own – this was certainly the case for those who heard Jesus preach. In the times when we struggle to follow, to understand, or even to believe the teachings given through the church, we can approach the Holy Spirit in humility, asking for the grace to see as God sees.

Hear to Serve...

CHOICES

It's Monday morning and as I sit here with my morning coffee going over my schedule, I think about all the choices I have to make for the week. I'm already starting to feel overwhelmed. Have you ever felt like that? All the decisions, all the choices made during a week, it would be nice to go back to bed, cover up, and hope the world forgets about me.

Well, in our first reading today, Sirach talks about choices that we must make and how the things we choose, God will certainly give to us. Sirach talks about choosing to keep the Commandments and about choosing fire and water. What Sirach is really telling us is that we must choose between life and death. Ouch! This is serious, I definitely want to go back to bed!

How do we choose? How do we want our life to go? Do we try to sit back and not make any choices? That will not work for us. Do we try to weigh all the options and go for the lesser of two evils? Do we want to choose power, control, or security, or do we choose to put it all into God's hands? Do we choose our own happiness first or do we put others first? Do we choose to pay back someone, to get even with them, to belittle them to others or do we choose to make amends with someone who has hurt us?



So how do we make all these tough choices in life? What can guide us on that journey to eternal life, or eternal death, that Sirach talks about? The answer we need is in the words of St. Paul as he addresses not only the Corinthians but us as well. Seek out the hidden wisdom.

St. Paul tells us that the wisdom is not of man and it's not wisdom of any age. He tells us that rulers, kings, queens, presidents or prime ministers will not impart upon us this hidden wisdom. It's not a wisdom that mankind's eye has seen, or heart has conceived. It is God's wisdom that we need to seek, and God will impart this wisdom on us through the Holy Spirit. For it's the Holy Spirit that knows the depths of God. This is the only wisdom that will allow us to make those choices to choose between eternal life or eternal death.

So, the next time at Mass when we pray the Prayer to the Holy Spirit, think about the choices we have to make. Let us ask for God's wisdom and for the gifts of the Holy Spirit to guide us. Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety, and Fear of the Lord.

With the Holy Spirit as our guide, we can be confident in making the choices that lead to eternal life because there is no going back to bed and pulling the covers over our heads.

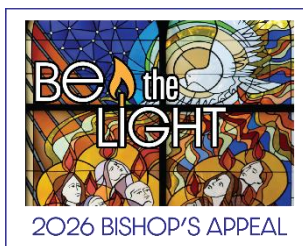
Little Black Books

Evening Vespers

Holy Trinity invites you to experience and participate in Vespers during Lent. Vespers (also called Evening Prayer) is part of the Liturgy of the Hours. The prayer experience will be held *Thursday evenings at 5:30pm* (in place of the rosary) prior to the 6pm Mass.

In the Liturgy of the Hours, the Church fulfills Jesus' command to "pray always" (Luke 18:1; see also 1 Thessalonians 5:17). Through this prayer, the people of God sanctify the day by continual praise of God and prayers of intercession for the needs of the world.

Bishops, priests, deacons, and many men and women in consecrated life pray the Liturgy of the Hours each day. Their work is organized around this prayer, keeping God always at the center of their days. Lay people are encouraged to pray the Liturgy of the Hours as well.

Evening Prayer gives thanks for the day just past and makes an evening sacrifice of praise to God (see Psalm 141:1).

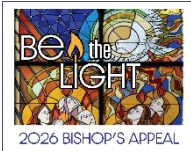
