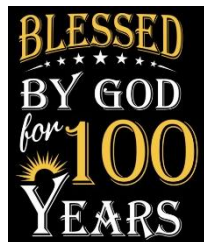

Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: The story of the disciples on the road to Emmaus mirrors the way that Jesus meets us in the celebration of the Mass. Before gathering at the eucharistic table, Jesus opens the Scriptures to them, sharing himself in word before offering himself in sacrament. It is the Scriptures that allow the disciples to enter into the mystery of the Eucharist with Jesus. Without knowing him as revealed in the history of God's chosen community, they could not hope to experience him under the appearance of bread and wine. This is the same reason that our celebration of the Mass begins by sharing the Scriptures together. This communal reading allows us to encounter God in the people of Israel, the life of the early Christian communities, and the ministry of Jesus. We come to know this Jesus that we receive into our bodies, as we are sent into the world with our hearts aflame.

To Experience: It's always good to go "back to the basics," and the Easter season is an especially great time for this. Peter's proclamation in Acts chapter 2 is a reminder of everything that is absolutely essential about the Christian faith – the love of God for us given in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, and all this despite our sin. No matter whether we are happy or sad, healthy or hurting, joyful or despairing, Jesus invites us to share the paschal mystery with him and to know his love for us.

1. Where has God shown you the path of life? What did this path look like?
2. In the second reading, Peter encourages us to "conduct yourselves with reverence during the time of your sojourning." What might reverence be for you at this point in time?
3. In the gospel reading, the disciples recognize that Jesus was in their presence only after he vanished from their sight. Have you ever had a similar, after-the-fact realization of God's presence in your life?

The journey to Emmaus is more than a story from the past; it is the living pattern for every Mass we celebrate today.

The Liturgy of the Word: Hearts on Fire

Just as Jesus drew near to the disciples and explained the Scriptures; he meets us in the Liturgy of the Word. When we listen to the readings, it is not just a history lesson; it is Christ himself "opening the Scriptures" to us. Our hearts burn within us as his Word pierces through our confusion and prepares us for the miracle to come.

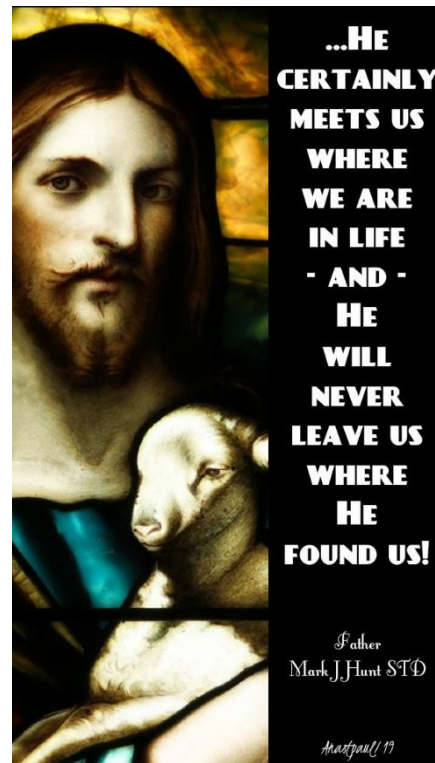
The Liturgy of the Eucharist: Eyes Wide Open

The "breaking open" of the Word leads directly to the breaking of the Bread. At the table in Emmaus, the disciples finally recognized Jesus in the four-fold action: He took, blessed, broke, and gave. This is exactly what happens at every altar. Through the Liturgy of the Eucharist, our eyes are opened to see that the Risen Lord is not a ghost or a memory, but truly present among us.

The Dismissal: Driven by Mission

Once they recognized Him, the disciples didn't stay put—they hurried back to Jerusalem to announce the Gospel. Every Mass ends with a similar "sending forth". Having been fed by his Word and Sacrament, we are commissioned to run back into our world to share the joy of the Resurrection with everyone we meet.

This Sunday, let us pray: "Lord, stay with us!" May our hearts burn as we hear Your Word and our eyes open as we receive Your Body.

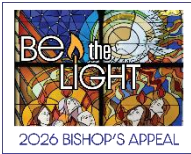
